Get Rid of the Clutter at MPK's Spring Cleaning Event

Drop off unwanted items at one of three locations on Saturday, April 23

The City of Monterey Park and Athens Services waste collection are offering residents an opportunity to clean up their unwanted items that are cluttering up space in the home, garage or basement. Used household appliances and fixtures, broken toys and old clothing are examples of things that can be dropped off.

Saturday, April 23, from 8 a.m. to 1 p.m., residents can take items to three locations:

- Elder Park, 950 Wilcox Avenue, Wilcox parking entrance.
- Langley Senior Center, 400 W. Emerson Avenue, southeast corner of parking lot.
- Monterey Highlands Elementary School, 400 Casuda Canyon Drive, on street.

Anything EXCEPT hazardous waste will be accepted. Electronic waste, such as a TV, is considered hazardous waste and will NOT be accepted. For information on how to dispose those hazardous waste items call 800-98-TOXIC or visit dpw.lacounty.gov/epd/hhw. The Los Angeles County Sanitation District also provides information on where to dispose of hazardous waste at their website at www.lacsd.org/solidwaste/swfacilities/recyclecontact/hhw_e_waste/.

The April 23 spring cleaning is a special, one-time event that is free to the community. Residents can also have bulky items picked up from the curbside if they call Athens at 888-336-6100. Bulky item pick-ups MUST be pre-arranged through Athens. Any items left abandoned on the curb can be subject to a notice of violation from Monterey Park Code Enforcement. Monterey Park Police Focus on Reducing Residential Burglaries

The Monterey Park Police Department has seen a rise in the number of burglaries - more specifically residential burglaries. Patrol officers and detectives have been focusing their efforts on reducing residential burglaries via crime suppression, but the reality is that it takes a community partnership to be successful in crime prevention. As such, residents are asked to keep the following in mind to minimize their chances of being victimized:

- Most burglaries occur during daytime hours and into the early evening.
- Always lock and secure your residence, even the smallest unlocked window provides access.
- Don't advertise valuables, especially during the holiday season.
- Maintain and trim back shrubbery so that subjects cannot easily conceal themselves.
- Secure valuables in a safe and actually lock the safe.
- Record serial numbers and descriptors of valuables.
- Consider installing a home surveillance recording system.
- Report suspicious activity such as a person jumping over a fence, the sound of shattering glass, unknown subjects "casing"

the area on foot or in a vehicle, etc in your neighborhood.

The current trend for burglars is to knock on a front door to check if anyone is home. If no one answers the assumption is that the residents are away. The burglars will then typically gain entry to the rear yard and enter through an unlocked door/window or shatter a window or the sliding glass door. If an alarm sounds upon entry it serves more so as a limited time frame to search for and obtain valuables. Suspects know that the delay in actually reporting the activated alarm to law enforcement can be from 5 to 10 minutes if not longer. Cash, jewelry, laptops, iPads, cellular phones, expensive purses and guns are common items stolen.

Trash Collection, Storage, Placement and Times in Plain Words

A reminder that trash and recycling containers should not be stored in front yards nor left out on the street for long periods of time

MPMC 9.54.0303(x): "Garbage, trash or recycling containers stored in front yards and visible from the public right-of-way, except when in places of collection and at times permitted by Chapter 6.08 of this code. Where the property is a corner lot, this subsection shall apply to storage of containers within those side-yard setbacks, which are adjacent to the street"

In plain words: Trash or recycling containers are not allowed to be stored in the front yard and visible from the public right-of-way (street or sidewalk). However, the containers may be stored in the side yard (other code restrictions may apply).

MPMC6.08.070 Bulky item collection: "So long as twenty-four hours prior notice has been given to the servicer, and subject to the time limits set forth in subsection 6.08.060(d), residential service recipients may place bulky items other than ordinary refuse and recyclables at the curb or alley for collection at the next normal weekly pickup. Refrigerators shall be picked up by the servicer within twenty-four hours of such notice. In instances where no curb exists, bulky items shall be placed as close to the edge of the street as practicable."

In plain words: Call Athens Disposal at least 24 hours before your collection date to

schedule a pick-up of bulky items (couch, sofa, and mattress). Place at the curb or alley for collection, as close to edge of street as possible (Electronics, computers and TVs are not considered bulky items.).

MPMC 6.08.060 (d) Containers for residential collection: "To minimize interference with the public rights-of-way, no person shall place a container or bulky item on a parkway for collection service earlier than twenty-four hours prior to the normal collection date as specified by the director of public works. To minimize interference with public rights-of-way, any containers not collected from or any bulky items not removed shall be removed from the public right-of-way location by midnight of the scheduled day of collection."

In plain words: Do not place trash, recycling containers or bulky items out for collection more than twenty four (24) hours prior to collection. By midnight on collection day, remove the empty containers from the street and store them properly on your property (not visible in the front yard).

The Early Days in Monterey Park

After Monterey Park incorporated in 1916, people moved here because they wanted land. Each lot was one acre in size. This allowed a household to raise vegetables, plant several fruit trees and raise chickens, rabbits and goats. In 1918, Jack Rugh's parents moved to Monterey Park. His father was a skilled journeyman carpenter and built the family home at 311 N. Alhambra Ave. Jack and his brother Larry walked to Ynez Grammar School, enjoying the sights each day along their one mile journey

The following appears in an essay written by Jack Rugh in 1996...

"During hot summers, I loved to fish for carp in Little Garvey Lake at Graves and Sefton. I obtained a ten foot bamboo pole with a hook made from a straight pin, a ten foot line of string, with a cork attached 12 inches above the hook that bobbed in the water whenever a fish bit. The bait was a small piece of flour dough. I left at dawn with my equipment and a medium sized galvanized steel bucket to bring home the catch!

At home my brother and I were required to help mother and father cultivate the soil, work in the annual garden of corn, squash, string beans, tomatoes, tend the orchard of deciduous fruit trees, feed the stock, e.g. chickens, rabbits, pigeons, goats and our jersey calf called Daisy. Tools were purchased

by my father at the local Garvey Hardware store."

Rugh met early resident Harry Herron while volunteering at the museum in 2002. One day Herron explained that he attended Alhambra High School because Mark Keppel High School had not yet been built. "However," he clarified, "I met Mark Keppel." Herron graduated from Garvey School in 1928 and, one June day, the principal instructed all students to wear shoes to school the following day. Graduation ceremonies were scheduled and an important person would give the commencement address. The Los Angeles Superintendent of Schools, Mr. Mark Keppel, had been invited. All students owned shoes, but boys usually attended school barefoot because the roads were unpaved and often muddy during the rainy season. Herron remembered the highlights of Superintendent Keppel's speech. "Mr. Keppel reminded students that every thought, word and action should move them closer to becoming the person that they hope to become."

The Historical Museum of Monterey Park at Garvey Ranch Park is open to the public free of charge each Saturday and Sunday afternoon between the hours of 2-4 p.m. Volunteers are available to answer questions about items on public display as well as those archived in the five room museum.



A Guide to the Night Sky

"In Like a Lion, Out Like a Lamb..." How many times have you heard this proverb? We've most likely associated this saying with the arrival of March, since the month begins in the midst of winter, but ends in the kinder, gentler, beginning of spring. The truth is, this saying has more to do with the stars than it does the weather.

This ancient folklore is about two specific constellations, Leo the Lion and Aires the Ram (or lamb). If you go outside around 8 p.m. early in the month and look above the western horizon, you will see the two faint stars (in our light polluted skies here in L.A.) that make up the constellation Aries the Ram. Turn 180 degrees to the east and the same distance above the eastern horizon you will see a group of stars that resembles a backwards question mark - the head of Leo the Lion. So the Lion is rising in the east in the beginning of March, hence the month coming in "like a lion."

Jump to March 31 about the same time at night (compensating for the time change of course) and Leo will be almost directly overhead while Aries the Ram (lamb) is about to disappear below the western horizon, hence, with Aries setting, the month of March is going out "like a lamb."

Also, March brings us the Vernal Equinox - or spring! At 9:24 p.m. on Saturday March 19, it officially becomes spring in the Northern Hemisphere and autumn in the Southern Hemisphere. "Equinox" is a latin term meaning "equal night," in which our lovely planet is neither leaning to-ward nor away from the Sun and, as a result, both the northern and southern hemispheres receive equal amounts of daylight and darkness. This is noticeable to us in the position of the Sun on the horizon when it rises and sets. On this day, the Sun rises directly due east and sets directly due west. All other times of the year, the Sun is rising and setting further north or south of these east and west cardinal points, depending which season we are in.

Ah, the planets! They're out there, you just have to know when and where to look. The

planets are the brightest lights in the sky so they are pretty easy to spot, since they are also the first lights to emerge during twilight. However, what makes them extra special is that these incredibly bright starlike objects wander - they move around - while the actual stars keep their same patterns. The word "planet" stems from the Greek word for "wander." Since the Sun, moon and planets all "wander" through the same path in the sky, we can actually use the moon as a tool to help us find the planets, especially the dimmer ones.

Jupiter is particularly prominent this month and for several months to come. Early in March, Jupiter rises in the east (as does everything) around 6:45 p.m. but by month's end, rises around 5:30 p.m. Look for the moon pairing up with Jupiter on the evening of the 22nd. Take it a step further - grab a pair of ordinary binoculars to spot four of Jupiter's 67 moons.

Venus and Mercury will be in the Sun's glare for most of the month but Saturn, which rises around 2 a.m. early in the month, pairs with the moon on the evening of the 2nd and then once again on the evening of the 29th, when the two will rise around 1 a.m. Mars rises around mid-night early in the month and then around 12:30 a.m. towards month's end. Look for the faint, orangish "star" next to the moon on the evening of the 28th. The two have their cosmic interlude, like all the other planets, for one night only, as the moon impatiently races through the ecliptic, orbiting our pale blue dot every 28 days....or month.

Have a great month as we bid a frigid "So Long!" to winter and a warm welcome to springtime!



Monterey Park Certified Farmers Market News

Spring is just around the corner but the market is still enjoying our peak winter season produce such as kohlrabi (also known as the cabbage turnip). Its name is derived from the German "kohl" for cabbage and the Latin "rapa" for turnip. Although typically available all year, it really peaks in flavor in the winter. About the size of baseball with a light purple or green coloring, kohlrabi is often sold without the tops (although the stems and leaves are edible). In the kitchen, Kohlrabi can be steamed, boiled or added to soups.



Farmers Market Tip of the Month

When picking kohlrabi, it is recommended to choose the smooth bulbs. They tend to be more flavorful. If the tops are still present, check that they are still fresh and firm. Kohlrabi bulbs will keep for at least a week in your refrigerator.

New Parking Ordinance for Oversized Vehicles

By Sergeant Brent Archibald, Monterey Park Police Department

With summer fast approaching, many Monterey Park residents will be taking their recreational vehicles out of storage which will increase the number of oversized vehicles parked on our residential streets. With this in mind, the city has enacted a new parking ordinance for oversized vehicles. Since parking these oversized vehicles on residential streets interferes with

the normal flow of traffic, the amount of time they may be parked will be limited. For a complete version of this new ordinance, “MPMC 10.64, entitled Oversized Vehicles and Trailer Parking,” please visit the city website at www.MontereyPark.ca.gov

What constitutes an oversized vehicle?

“Oversized vehicle” means any vehicle which exceeds 25 feet in length; or exceeds 80 inches in width; or exceeds 82 inches in height.

What constitutes a trailer?

“Trailer” means a trailer, semi-trailer, camp trailer, unmounted camper, boat trailer, or trailer coach as defined in the California Vehicle Code.

Can I park my oversized vehicle in front of my house without a permit?

No, it is unlawful for any person to park or leave standing any oversized vehicle on any street in a residential area at anytime or in a business area for more than two (2) hours.

Exceptions:


- Loading or unloading.
- Temporary or emergency repairs.
- Picking up or dropping off goods.
- Holding a valid oversized parking permit.
- Holding a valid oversized vehicle handicap permit.
- Public emergency vehicle.

What will the permit / handicap permit allow?

- The owner of the oversized vehicle to park adjacent to their residence to load or unload.
- Out of town visitors to park adjacent to the residence for a limited time.

How do I get an oversized vehicle parking permit and how long is it good for?

- Come to the front counter of the Monterey Park Police Department. (Monday-Friday, 7 a.m.-8 p.m. and Saturday-Sunday, 8 a.m.-5 p.m.)
- Complete an application containing the following:
 - The name, address and phone number of the registered owner and applicant of the designated oversized vehicle.
 - The license number, make and model of the designated oversized vehicle.
 - The dates for which the permit is requested.
 - The dates and duration of any and all oversized vehicles permits issued to the applicant within the immediately preceding 90 day period.
- The permit is valid for a period not to exceed three consecutive calendar days.
- In no event will oversized vehicle parking permits be issued to an applicant for a total period in excess of 12 days within any consecutive 90 day period.

Elementary School Bond Measure Pays Off For AUSD

Alhambra Unified School District is currently enjoying vast improvements to its schools due to the Elementary School Bond Measure MM, which became effective on November 4, 2008. The District developed Master Plans for the thirteen Elementary Schools to make sure the District and the Community were informed as to the needs of the schools. The goal was to provide a 10-year master plan for all of the District's elementary schools, to developing a detailed plan, inclusive of input from all designated stakeholders, and an implementation plan and budget. Due to excellent leadership and a clear plan, AUSD has proven up to the challenge of executing their promise to deliver these improvements and have exceeded expectations in spending the bond dollars efficiently and effectively. The District was also able to leverage the bond dollars with matching state and federal funds to maximize the use of the bond funds through efficient planning, management, and timing to stretch those dollars even farther.

The focus areas of this project included new playgrounds, cafeterias, outdoor eating spaces, gardens, and classrooms. Initial bond funding was for 50 million dollars. With the additional funds that were received, the district was able to secure 20.3 million dollars of additional funding which allowed them to build more. To date, the district has committed 39 million dollars to new classroom buildings, 6.2 million dollars to new playgrounds, 6.8 million dollars to information technology upgrades, 2.3 million dollars for a new cafeteria building, and 6.7 million dollars for site and structure upgrades not listed above.

One product of this construction project that the district will soon benefit from is a structure at Monterey Highlands Elementary. This building consists of a 2-story building housing 4 classrooms, three computer labs, a music classroom and restroom facilities to replace aging portable classrooms. The new building is located prominently in the middle of the campus and will create a new courtyard gathering space that will be framed on the east by an existing two-story classroom building. A new pedestrian bridge connects the new classrooms to an existing elevator and walkway system to satisfy ADA requirements. The building is currently under construction and will be ready for the 2016/17 school year.

Another project that will be opening in the 2016-2017 school year is a classroom building at Repetto Elementary. The building is 1-story, housing 10 classrooms plus a computer lab and restroom facilities to replace portable classrooms. Located along Grandridge Avenue, it provides a presence on the street as well as a safe barrier along the perimeter of the campus.

Under the direction of Superintendent Dr. Laura Tellez-Gagliano and the Board of Education, Adele Andrade-Stadler, Pat Rodriguez-Mackintosh, Jane C. Anderson, Joanne Russell-Chavez, and Robert L. Gin, the district's goal in this long-term objective has been to provide the best learning environment possible to enable students to excel. It is safe to say that Alhambra Unified School District's elementary schools are a better place today due to the time and effort that was spent.






