Avoid the line, Try Our New Payment Kiosk in the City Hall Lobby

The City of Monterey Park has just added a new self-serve payment kiosk for utility bill customers to use, eliminating the need to wait in line.

The new self-service payment kiosk makes it fast and easy for walk-in customers to make automated, unassisted payments any time of the day, any day of the week. You can access your utility account, find your current balance, and pay with your credit/debit card easily, and be on your way. Using the kiosk is simple:

1. Enter your utility account number (without the dash) as shown on your bill.
2. Enter your email address (for an email

confirmation of your payment).

3. Press "Continue."
4. Enter your Payment Information (First Name, Last Name, Zip Code, Phone Number) associated with the credit card used for your payment.
5. Pay the Current Amount Due (shown on screen) or enter a different amount.
6. Press "Swipe My Card Now."
7. Swipe your Credit Card.
8. Press "Done."

City of Monterey Park Celebrates "The Power of Public Works" Wednesday, May 23





Monterey Park Market Place Update

The community has been waiting decades for the development of the Monterey Park Market Place - the largest commercial shopping center ever developed in the city. This is a 43 acre commercial property located in the southeastern portion of the city that is situated on the north side of the 60 Freeway just west of the Paramount Boulevard off-ramp. The property has fantastic visibility from the freeway allowing tens of thousands of daily commuters to see the commercial shopping center, enticing commuters to venture into the city and shop at the Market Place.

The ground breaking for the Market Place occurred on November 16, 2016, but the community was somewhat skeptical about the development since there had been other ground breaking ceremonies in the past. Over the last year, commuters along the 60 Freeway have been able to watch the once vacant dirt area transform into a viable shopping center. To date, the majority of the site improvements have been completed and the construction of Costco and the Home Depot buildings are almost complete. The skepticism about the development of the shopping center has now waned and there is excitement in the air about the opening of the Market Place.

At this time, Costco anticipates opening their store around the end of May and Home Depot around the end of June of this year. The City of Monterey Park has issued a building permit to Chick-fil-A so that they can commence construction; will be issuing a building permit to the Guitar Center shortly; and is currently reviewing construction plans for In-N-Out and Mod Pizza. The city also anticipates that construction plans will be submitted for Buffalo Wild

Wings, Starbucks, Ono Hawaiian BBQ and Panda Express shortly. The developer anticipates that the construction activities and the occupancy of the remaining tenant spaces will be completed by the end of 2018.

As the grand openings are announced, city staff will post this information on the city's website.

Japanese-Americans Set Down Roots in Monterey Park

It was the late 1940s. World War II had ended and Americans were adjusting to life in peacetime. Monterey Park was a typical small town with a population a little more than 9,000.

Many Japanese American Issei (first generation) and Nisei (second generation) found work in farming, landscaping and gardening, and veterans took advantage of the GI Bill and went to college to study for careers in engineering, law, medicine and teaching.

Many were starting families and looking beyond Boyle Heights for more suitable places to raise their children. It was the building boom in Monterey Park that attracted them. The earliest tract was the area just south of East Los Angeles College, then still East LA. It was a nice area, and the new school, Robert Hill Lane, was close by. The Japanese students were diligent learners and the school gained a good reputation. To this day, many teachers there are Japanese American. In later years, when the 60 freeway was built, this area became incorporated into Monterey Park.

By the late 50s into the early 60s, large tracts were being built in the hills, and young Nisei families were among the many who sought homes here. These areas were an interesting demographic mix of Caucasian, Hispanic, Jewish people, and Japanese, to name a few. Many were young AJA (Americans of Japanese Ancestry) from Hawaii, who were coming to the Los Angeles area seeking better jobs and higher incomes.

It was a perfect place to live. Jobs in Los Angeles offices and businesses were only 8 miles away and freeways were making commuting a lot easier. New schools were being built to accommodate the families moving into the new tracts, Japanese restaurants were opening and it was close enough to Little Tokyo for shopping.

The Brightwood area was, by the late 60s, called "Banzai Hill" because so many Japanese American professional and white collar families were buying available homes in the area.

In 1967, the Monterey Park First United Methodist Church, recognizing the need of this new community, opened the first Japanese classes. The Saturday morning classes ranged from beginner to high school, with a maximum of 150 students. Graduating high school students could take a proficiency test to qualify for their language requirement.

Sage Methodist Church, a Japanese-American congregation located in El Monte since the 1930s under the ministry of Rev. Jutaro Yokoi, relocated to the Monterey Park First Methodist Church and used their church facilities from 1974 until 1994. When the congregation relocated to Granada Park Methodist Church in Alhambra, the Language School moved with Sage.

In the 60s and 70s, George Ige was president of the Democratic Club, was elected Monterey Park City Treasurer, Monterey Park City Councilman and also was chosen mayor two times (this was when the mayor was elected by the city council). Yukio Kawaratani's name is heard frequently for his work on city commissions, committees and campaigns. He was instrumental in getting the Bruggemeyer Library expanded to its present size. His wife, Lilian, has the distinction of being the most senior member on the board of the Friends of the Library and is a longtime volunteer teacher at the library's citizenship program. Kei

Higashi, who had a successful aluminum furniture business in Monterey Park, rose from Boy Scout troop worker to President of the San Gabriel Valley Boy Scout Council. He was President of the Monterey Park Rotary Club and on the Board of Directors for Garfield Medical Center and the Nachikatsuura Sister City organization. Who can forget Agnes Arakawa, who was active in the establishment of the Sister City program with Nachikatsuura, Japan, being the first? She was involved with the Monterey Park Woman's Club for many years and could be seen participating at many city events.

Fast forward to 2018: the families grew up; children went on to colleges and careers that took them away from Monterey Park; and many moved away to newer communities. However, there is evidence of the AJA community still present in Monterey Park.

Japanese American basketball and baseball leagues, organized for boys and girls from kindergarten to eighth grade, are still active.

The Japanese Americans who still live in Monterey Park have gotten older, but are actively participating in the community. Once a month, the Monterey Park Japanese American Senior Citizens, a 300 member organization led by Bill Shishima for decades, holds a meeting at Langley Senior Center with speakers, opportunities for travel to Europe, Japan and in the U.S., and luncheons for special occasions.

There is a lovely Japanese Garden tucked into the patio of the Langley Center. The focal point of this garden is an eight foot high pagoda, built by George Sagara. Lila Saito, an artist known for her Japanese silk paintings, used her skills to design the garden. Both put their time and talent to give those of us who see it, a sense of quiet and calm.

We still have the annual Cherry Blossom Festival in April every year. Demonstrations of ikebana (flower arrangement), martial arts, mochi making (Japanese confections) and origami (folded paper designs) are featured. Performances of hula, taiko (Japanese drumming), music groups, and odori (Japanese dancing) are some of the must-see entertainment opportunities. It is a time to remember our roots.

Learn more about this topic and more at the Historical Museum of Monterey Park. Open each Saturday and Sunday afternoon between the hours of 2-4 p.m. and located adjacent to the observatory in Garvey Ranch Park at 781 S. Orange Ave. Monterey Park, CA 91754. Volunteers are available to answer questions and explain exhibits.

Guide to the Night Sky

This month brings the prominent return of two of the brightest lights in the evening sky: Jupiter (The Roman King of The Gods) and Venus (The Roman Goddess of Beauty and Love). I say prominent because both have been in the sky prior to May, but now both will be visible in the early evening/twilight sky simultaneously.

Starting off in Taurus the Bull and mid month, moving into Gemini The twins, Venus, continuing her orbit around the Sun, will appear to slowly climb higher in our skies until sometime around mid June, when she then begins a slow descent, heading back towards the western horizon. Jupiter however, in the constellation Libra the Scales, is low in the eastern sky at twilight, rising around 9 p.m. early in the month and 7 p.m. by month's end. In fact, near the end of May, you can look west and see Venus, then turn around looking east and see Jupiter, both will be about the same distance above their respective horizons. They should be fairly obvious since both objects are the next brightest things in the sky after the Sun and Moon.

Mercury, The Roman Messenger of the Gods, will be lost in much of the Sun's glare this month but Mars and Saturn, both in the constellation Sagittarius the Archer, are visible although they both rise much later than Jupiter. Early in the month, Saturn, the Roman God of Agriculture, rises around 1 a.m. in the southeast, followed about an hour later by Mars

rising around 2 a.m. By month's end however, Saturn makes his way above the eastern horizon almost two hours earlier, rising around 11 p.m., while Mars now follows Saturn a full two hours later, as the Roman God of War drifts further and further away from the quintessential ringed gas giant.

So, imagine yourself in space, above our Solar System, looking down at the Sun and all of the planets orbiting it. One thing you would notice is that all of the planets (and their moons) travel in the same plane around the sun. So here on Earth, visually that translates to the Sun, Moon and planets all traveling the same path in the sky. As the Moon orbits our Earth once every 28 (+/-) days, it appears to slip past the planets, thereby making the Moon a great tool for finding these elusive wandering lights! (The word planet is derived from the Greek word for wander, because the planets move or wander thru the sky.) In the wee hours of May 4th, 5th and 6th, look to the southeast between 3-4 a.m. to see the Moon travel with Saturn on 5/4, then travel between Saturn and Mars on 5/5 and finally, the Moon hangs out with Mars the morning of 5/6. If that's too early for you (it is for me), look low in the west all month long at the beautiful glowing Venus, which is so bright it's often mistaken for a helicopter or airplane coming toward you. During the early evening twilight of May 17, a thin crescent moon joins Venus low in the western sky. It will not be there long as both will set rather quickly. On the evening of the 27th (10 days later) the Moon, continuing its eastward trek, is now

paired up with Jupiter in the east. Look for both when it's dark enough to see Jupiter's bright glow.

On May 29, we will be treated to this month's full "flower" moon, marking the time of year when flowers spring forth in abundance. Since the Moon is in constant motion around our planet, it's only technically full for a moment - this month at 7:21 am - but will appear full to the casual observer not only the day of, but also the day before and the day after. Keep in mind that the Moon rises approximately 50 minutes later each subsequent night (and/or day).

So that's it for this month. Next month is the summer solstice, so stay tuned. Also, if you have any questions, please feel free to email me at tre@tregibbs.com and I will do my best to answer all of your astronomical questions. Until next month, keep looking up!

10 Fun Facts About Tooth Brushes

1. When selecting your toothbrush, look for the ADA Seal.

The ADA Seal of Acceptance is the gold standard for toothbrush quality. It's how you'll know an independent body of scientific experts, the ADA Council on Scientific Affairs, has evaluated your toothbrush to make sure bristles won't fall out with normal use, the handle will stay strong and the toothbrush will help reduce your risk for cavities and gum disease.

2. The toothbrush is 5,000 years old.

In various forms, that is. Ancient civilizations used a "chew stick," a thin twig with a frayed end, to remove food from their teeth. Over time, toothbrushes evolved and were made from bone, wood or ivory handles and stiff bristles of hogs, boar or other animals. The modern nylon-bristled toothbrush we use today was invented in 1938.

3. The first mass-produced toothbrush was invented in prison.

In 1770, an Englishman named William Addis was jailed for inciting a riot. He saw fellow prisoners using a rag covered in soot or salt to clean their teeth. Addis saved an animal bone from dinner and received bristles from a guard. Accounts state he bored tiny holes into the bone, inserted the bristles and sealed them with glue. After his release, he modified his prototype, started a company and manufactured his toothbrush. That company, Wisdom Toothbrushes, still exists in the United Kingdom today.

4. Manual or powered? Your teeth don't care, if you do it right.

In the manual and powered toothbrush debate, it's a wash. You just need to brush twice a day for two minutes with a fluoride toothpaste. Both types of toothbrushes can effectively and thoroughly clean your teeth. It all depends on which one you prefer. People who find it difficult to use a manual toothbrush may find a powered toothbrush more comfortable. Talk to your dentist about which kind is best for you. If you do decide to use a powered toothbrush, you must hold it with your fingers, like how you would hold a flute. Don't hold it in the palm of your hand. Palming your power toothbrush is likely to cause excessive pressure on your teeth and gums.

5. There is no "correct" order for brushing and flossing.

Brushing before flossing, flossing before brushing—it doesn't matter to your teeth, as long as you do both. However, be very careful not to cut your gums when you floss. Over-zealous flossing can cause spaces (dark triangles) to form between your teeth as well as gum recession.

6. Toothbrushes like to be left out in the open.

Cleaning your toothbrush is easy: Rinse it with tap water to remove any remaining toothpaste and debris. Store it upright and allow it to air dry. If you store your toothbrush with other toothbrushes, make sure they are separated to prevent cross contamination. And do not routinely cover toothbrushes or store them in closed containers. A moist environment such as a closed container is more conducive to the growth of unwanted bacteria than the open air.

7. Lifespan = 3-4 Months

Make sure to replace your toothbrush every three to four months, or sooner if the bristles are frayed. A worn toothbrush won't do as good of a job cleaning your teeth.

8. When it comes to choosing a brush, go soft.

Whether you use a manual or powered toothbrush, choose a soft-bristled brush. Firm or even medium-strength bristles may cause damage to your gums and enamel. When brushing your teeth, don't scrub vigorously—only brush hard enough to clean the film off your teeth.

9. Remember: 2 minutes, 2 times a day.

4 minutes a day goes a long way for your dental health. Put the time in each day to keep your smile healthy and keep up this twice-a-day habit.

10. Sharing is caring, but not for toothbrushes.

Sharing a toothbrush can mean you're also sharing germs and bacteria. This could be a particular concern if you have a cold or flu to spread, or you have a condition that leaves your immune system compromised.

AUSD's Grab 'N' Go Breakfast Program Wins USDA "Champions of Breakfast" Award

With help from AASA, Walmart Foundation and CDE grants, AUSD students are fueling their mornings to increase health and concentration

Thanks to the AUSD's new Grab 'N' Go program funded by a combination of grants from the School Superintendents Association (AASA), the Walmart Foundation and the California Department of Education, Alhambra USD students are grabbing the most important meal for learning and health, one most of them had been skipping — breakfast.



For its innovative school breakfast model, the USDA recently awarded Alhambra USD's Grab 'N' Go breakfast program its "Champions of Breakfast" Award during National School Breakfast Week in March 2018.

The initial CDE start-up summer meal expansion grant of \$134,765 in May 2017 was followed in September 2017 by support from AASA and the Walmart Foundation, both so impressed with the AUSD new approach to student morning nutrition that they awarded a \$132,485 grant for the Grab 'N' Go Breakfast program. The only district in California to win such a ASSA + Walmart Foundation grant, AUSD was also one of only eight districts in the country sponsored by the Walmart Foundation.

Last year, when AUSD Superintendent Denise Jaramillo, Director of Business Services Vivien Watts and William Fong, Director of Food and Nutrition, looked at data showing that students were not eating breakfast offered in the school cafeteria or at home because they were rushing to be on time for class, the trio noticed some staggering statistics. With only 16.8 percent of K-8 students and only 4.8 percent of high school students were participating in school breakfast on a daily basis, and even fewer eating breakfast at home, William Fong set out to develop a comprehensive District plan to change those numbers, a plan in keeping with its Whole Student approach to academic success.

To make it easier, faster and more tempting to give the students the edge they need to succeed in school and stay healthy, William Fong created the Grab 'N' Go breakfast program. The program involves setting up multiple breakfast stations on campuses to provide a variety of portable, pre-wrapped, nutritious meal options at school entrances, in parking lots, hallways and other high traffic areas.

Building a new, flexible, quasi-food truck, mobile kiosk breakfast model for a district with 17,000 students on 19 campuses required funding assistance, a road map and a roll-out strategy. Breakfasts marked EAT NOW and TAKE NOW/EAT LATER give students new ways to get the nutrition they need to concentrate, stay healthy, increase academic success and social emotional learning, and reduce behavior problems, nurse visits and tardiness.

The Grab 'N' Go program rolled out at Alhambra High School in October 2017, and has since been implemented at Mark Keppel High School, San Gabriel High School, Ramona

Elementary, Northrup Elementary, and Ynez, Park Garfield and Emery Park and Baldwin Elementary Schools. According to new data, the number of students eating breakfast has increased by 28 percent in February 2018 when compared to same month last year.

As part of the Grants' outreach mandates, AUSD is also publishing research-based Benefits of Breakfast brochures and videos for students and parents. Videos feature students talking on camera about the positive effective of eating breakfast daily.
