

## Computers for Keppel Campaign

Mark Keppel High School is the highest academically performing of the three high schools in the Alhambra Unified School District with a score of 864 on the most recent California State Tests (CST). The Mark Keppel High School Alliance and PTSA are the two major parent organizations at Mark Keppel, with parents logging in thousands of volunteer hours annually.

Although Mark Keppel students are excelling academically, the cutbacks in state funding have definitely been felt at the high school. Class sizes have increased, materials and resources have decreased, and the demands on teachers have become even greater. Keeping up with technology has been impossible, but Mark Keppel is attempting to upgrade their equipment through private donors. By 2014, ALL state testing of students will be conducted online, and at this time, Mark Keppel's technology is not equipped to handle the upgraded software.

The Alliance is currently campaigning to raise at least \$40,000 to purchase new computers in preparation for the new California testing procedures. ## The Intersection

We here at the Monterey Park Police Department want to thank many of our motoring citizens for their compliance with the Distracted Driving Campaign last month. During the first week of enforcement officers cited nearly 100 drivers for either talking or texting on their cell phone while driving. The Month of May is California's Bicycle Awareness Month. May 8, 2013 is "Bike to School Day" and May 13-17, 2013 is "Bike to Work Week". I call upon cyclist and motorist alike to be cautious during the month and every month throughout the year. Here are a couple bicycling facts, which can also be seen at the California Office of Traffic safety website (www.ots.ca.gov)



- The total number of bicycle deaths has remained flat for the last two reporting years, while injuries have increased 4.6%.
- During the months of summer bicycle deaths for children can increase by 45%.

Remember bicycles are considered a vehicle when on the roadway and most comply with traffic laws. I want to stress the importance that cyclist should travel with the flow of traffic and stay to the far right of the roadway. According to the Automobile Club of Southern California cyclists riding against traffic are often hit by a car at a corner where the car is making a right turn. This and other wrong way driving is associated with 21% of injuries and 8% of fatalities in bike/car crashes.

Once again the Monterey Park Police Traffic Bureau Police was given the opportunity to make an impact with our local elementary school students. On April 5, 2013 Monterey Vista Elementary School hosted the "Read Across America" event. Police Clerk Diane Giannone and Community Service Officer Lynn Enrico volunteered to read to the students of Mrs. Lee's Kindergarten and Mrs. Han's 2nd grade class. On May 16, 2013 they will be volunteering to participate in Monterey Highland Elementary School's "Be A Smart Cookie" read-in. While interacting with the students, they are able to introduce the topic of pedestrian and bicycle safety.

### Dispose of Household Hazardous Waste and E-Waste the right way on Saturday: MAY 25, 2013

**BUSINESS WASTE WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.**

**What you CAN bring to an event (examples):**

- Brake fluid, paint, paint thinner, cleaners with acid or lye, pesticides or herbicides, household batteries and car batteries, pool chemicals, motor oil, oil filters, expired pharmaceuticals, anti-freeze, and fluorescent light bulbs.
- Household electronic waste which includes: Computer monitors, televisions, computer CPUs, keyboards, printers, cellular phones, etc.

**What you CAN'T bring to an event:**

- Hazardous waste and electronic waste from businesses.
- Explosives, ammunition and radioactive materials.
- Trash and tires.
- White goods such as refrigerators, stoves and washing machines etc.
- Controlled substances.

**How to prepare items for transportation:**

- Bring the items in a sturdy box, preferably in their original labeled containers.
- Do not mix the items together.
- There is a limit of 15 gallons or 125 pounds of hazardous waste per trip.
- Be prepared to leave your containers and boxes. Remove all other items from your trunk.

Roundup will occur every 10 days and is sponsored by the Department of Public Works and the Southern District of Los Angeles County in cooperation with the Los Angeles County Business Center, County of Orange, Redding Fire, (Lynwood, Hemet), Monterey Park, Pasadena, Pomona, San Bernardino, San Gabriel, San Jose, and San Luis Obispo.

## City Council Meeting of March 20, 2013

The City Council meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m., with all Council Members present.

There were no Agenda additions, deletions, changes, and adoptions.

### SUCCESSOR AGENCY CONSENT CALENDAR

**Agenda Item 1** The City Council approved payment of warrants and adopted Resolution No. SA-35 of the Successor Agency to the former Monterey Park Redevelopment Agency allowing certain claims and demands per warrant register dated March 20, 2013 totaling \$4,986.71 and specifying the funds out of which the same are to be paid.

**Agenda Item 2** The City Council received and filed the Successor Agency's Investment Report of February 2013.

### NEW BUSINESS

**Agenda Item 3** The City Council adopted Resolution No. SA-36 certifying the

approval of the Final Certificate of Completion for the Atlantic Times Square Project.

### CONSENT CALENDAR

**Agenda Item 4** The City Council approved payment of warrants and adopted Resolution No. 11559 allowing certain claims and demands per Warrant Register dated March 20, 2013 Totaling \$1,079,522.46 and specifying the funds out of which the same are to be paid.

**Agenda Item 5** The City Council received and filed the Investment Report of February 2013.

**Agenda Item 6** The City Council authorized the City Manager, or designee, to approve the purchase of a Kubota L45 loader/backhoe from Eberhard Equipment, the lowest bidder at the cost of \$61,256.14.

**Agenda Item 7** The City Council authorized the City Manager to execute an agreement, in a form approved by the City Attorney, with CivicPlus to provide a complete redesign of the City's website, as well as the migration of pages from the current site, and hosting services for the next four years.

### NEW BUSINESS




## What's In Your House?

The Monterey Park Police Department's Community Relations Bureau strives to help residents, business owners and visitors to our City better protect themselves and keep from becoming victims. But, just as no city is immune to crime, there are occasions when those in our community might be victimized. Although we cannot completely eliminate crime in our City, we can prepare ourselves for it and minimize its intrusion into our daily lives. A common problem encountered by officers when they respond to a residential or vehicle break-in is that the owner of the property often doesn't have a good description of what was taken or they have no serial or model numbers for their property. Many times, recovered stolen property is not able to be returned to its owner because the person did not have a serial number to give to the officers at the time it was stolen. This can hamper investigative efforts to solve these crimes, put criminals behind bars, and return a victim's property to where it rightfully belongs.

One way you can prepare yourself is to make an inventory of items in your home and vehicles. There are several ways this can be accomplished: One simple way to document your belongings is to go through and list everything identifiable in a notebook. A room-by-room log is a great way to organize this list. Another, more structured approach is to purchase a log designed specifically for this purpose. Office supply stores sell books in which people can record information such as item name, model and serial numbers, a basic or detailed description, and value. Some of these books are simple ledger-style while others are formatted like a family photo album; complete with a slot for photographs of the item being documented next to its description. Some people have used a video recorder to walk through their house, room-by-room; This allows the owner to focus on certain specific items as well as also taking in an overall view of a room. This method, when combined with a log of property items and serial numbers will provide good documentation should they find themselves victim of a crime. Higher up on the technology ladder are computer programs designed specifically for keeping track of items in your home. These programs can organize your whole household inventory with a simple fill-in-the-blanks program. These programs can be purchased online or in a computer software store for a reasonable price. These types of programs can also be found free on the internet. As with any internet purchase or download, do your homework and make sure you have chosen a reputable seller to deal with.

Whichever method of home inventory you chose to use, there are three key points to remember. First, Use It! Just having the inventory program or book isn't enough...you'll need to fill it out. This can seem like a daunting task at first, but breaking the project down into smaller parts will help to keep it manageable. Try starting out one room at a time. Before you know it, you'll have the whole house finished. Second, Update it. The list of property you filled out several years ago probably has a number of items which have been replaced. You already did the hard work by compiling all the information. Staying up to date by logging new items when you get them is a great way to keep the list current. Third, Don't leave it around. This list will contain a lot of valuable information, but if it gets lost, stolen by a criminal, or damaged during a fire or natural disaster, it will be of no use to you. An actual book should be locked in a fire resistant file cabinet or safe. A computer file should be kept somewhere other than on the home computer. Consider keeping the list on a removable disc or on a computer kept somewhere else, such as at work.

No one wants to become a victim of a crime, but by taking these steps to safeguard your property, you can ease the pain and increase your chances of getting your property back if it should be taken. 



# A Guide to the Night Sky for May 2013

As we bid farewell to the King, we welcome the Beauty and gaze upon a Beast...

Saturn, the quintessential planet, complete with its spectacular ring system, is positioned this month for prime viewing. Rising around 8:00 pm in the beginning of the month and around 6:00 pm towards month's end, Saturn is just slightly beyond overhead at midnight, giving sky watchers a feast for the aided eye. The mythology of the Roman God Saturn is rather beastly - not only did he cut off cupid's wings, but he also devoured his own children, for fear that they would one day overthrow him.



Regardless, make a point to come to Garvey Ranch and look at Saturn through a telescope - it will be worth the trip! Saturn's north pole is tilted towards Earth, giving us one of the best views of its ring system since 2006.

Early on the evening of May 22nd, you will find a waxing gibbous moon rising with Saturn. Although the moon is slowly moving away from Saturn, which becomes obvious the following evening, be sure to look for the pair as they travel the sky together, with Saturn appearing just to the left of the moon.

Although Saturn steals the show, we must remember to bid farewell to the King of the planets, Jupiter - though the exit of the King also marks the return of the Beauty, the planet Venus. The Goddess of Love is making her way back into our western sky at sunset once again. At dusk on May 27th, if you have an unobstructed view of the western horizon, you will be able to see Jupiter, Venus & Mercury group together in what's known as a conjunction. Venus is the brightest, then Jupiter and then faint Mercury. Only four days later, the three planets will appear to be in a straight line, with Jupiter closest to the horizon, then Venus above it and to the left, and follow the line even higher to see Mercury. All three planets will be spaced evenly apart - a spectacular sight!

Venus will continue to climb higher and higher in our western sky as she continues her orbit around the Sun, moving closer to Earth. Venus is another spectacular sight in a telescope but for a much different reason than Saturn. While Saturn has the most impressive ring system that we will probably ever see, Venus goes through phases just like our own Moon does. Be sure to gaze at Venus through a telescope at Garvey Ranch and you'll be seeing the exact same thing that Galileo Galilei saw over 400 years ago, which helped convince him that Earth was NOT the center of the universe.

Over the next six months, as Venus catches up to Earth's orbit, the "Evening Star" will change - it will go from a tiny gibbous to a larger quarter phase, and then an even larger crescent as it heads towards the sun, appearing lower in the western sky near year's end.

Enjoy the celestial wonders this May, celebrate Saturn's magnificent glory - and keep looking up!

Deep cleaning followed by gum surgery is often offered as an answer. Non-surgical options are available. Most recently "endoscopy" in conjunction with laser has become available so that bacterial plaque and calcium deposits along with infected tissue can be completely removed, without surgery. To keep infection from recurring, certain "mouth pieces" or trays that can deliver anti-bacterial solutions to the infected crevices between the teeth and gum are predictably successful in prevent recurrence of gum disease.

Ask your dentist what treatment options are available to you. Ask your physician for advice regarding the prevention or treatment for obesity.



# SGHS wins First Place in State Competition

The San Gabriel High School publications program exploded into cheers as junior John Truong placed first in Editorial Cartoon and seniors Anna Huang and Ronald Eusebio placed first in Yearbook Sweepstakes at the state journalism finals sponsored by the South California Journalism Education Association (SCJEA). Seventeen schools, including Redondo Union and Walnut, competed on April 13 at California State University, Long Beach.

The last time San Gabriel won the state Yearbook Sweepstakes was in 2007. Working in a duo, Huang and Eusebio captured first in Yearbook Copy and second in Yearbook Layout to claim the overall sweepstakes prize and two gleaming trophies for the school. Schurr High School tied with San Gabriel for Yearbook Sweepstakes.

SCJEA is a scholastic write-off competition consisting of 10 different categories in journalism, photography, and design. During the competition, student journalists listen to the speakers or press conferences and then write for one hour. Yearbook teams have two hours to design and write a two page spread based on information given that day. Overall, The Matador and El Camino Real staffs placed 13 times within the events:

Newspaper division: seniors Debbie Dinh (2nd place, Feature Writing), Ryan Luong (5th News Photography); juniors John Truong (1st, Editorial Cartoon), Steven Ho (4th, News Writing), Vanessa De La Rosa (6th, Editorial), Sonny Hy (12th, Editorial), Marvin Luu (13th, Sports Writing); sophomores Annie Huang (3rd, Editorial Cartoon), Rebecca Lei (14th place, Critical Review), Kaleen Luu (14th, Feature Writing).

Yearbook division: seniors Anna Huang and Ronald Eusebio (1st, Yearbook Copy, 2nd Yearbook Layout), junior Natalie Ma (6th, Feature Photography).

When Truong's name was announced for winning first place in Editorial Cartoon, the entire room shook with laughter and cheers from the San Gabriel team.

"For a whole year people were laughing at my pictures in journalism class, but when they called my name out for first place, I saw Ms. Kim, yearbook, [and] everyone just so surprised and laughing so hard when I [sat] back down. I thought I was seriously dreaming because at ELAJEA I got last place," Truong said. ELAJEA is the East Los Angeles Journalism Education Association who sponsors the regional journalism competition. Mr. Truong placed 10th in regionals, which just qualified him to compete at state.

Since Truong's drawings are peculiar and eccentric, nobody expected such an outcome.

"Everyone was shocked because John's drawings were so unique and different from what they usually saw, and I guess we all didn't expect him to win because of that, but he totally flipped the tables around and surprised everyone," sophomore newspaper staffer Kaleen Luu said.

Adviser Jennifer Kim said that Truong has "a great sense of humor and that definitely shows through his work. I'm so happy for him."

Although the mood was uplifted upon hearing Truong placing first, Huang and Eusebio were not confident in their yearbook copy, and Eusebio expected to place third place at most. Only having a set goal of having fun, Huang also did not have high hopes on placing high in sweepstakes, the top prize.

"I told myself that I have no one to prove anything to and no legacy to carry on so just go in and have fun. And since I won first in yearbook copy at ELAJEA, I'll be happy even if I place fifth at SCJEA. Overall, I didn't really set a high expectation for myself and my goal of the whole competition was to have fun," Huang said.

"It was crazy fun. Spending time with my friends from journalism really made the day special for me. Even with the rivalry, we all support each other and we all clapped for each other at the award ceremonies. Being surrounded by friends made winning that much more amazing," Eusebio said.

## Q and A with LIFT Teacher Kathleen Doyle on her Rotary Club of Alhambra grant

**Q: Please describe your program.**

A: I teach an adult transition program for students with disabilities ages 18 - 22 years. Our program is called LIFT: Learning Independence For Transition. The program is designed to help students with disabilities who have finished high school to become as independent as possible. These are students who have earned a certificate of completion, but not a diploma. Our students learn real life skills, like money math and management; daily living skills, like cooking and cleaning; vocational skills, through volunteer work; and mobility training, which includes use of public transportation.

We are a new program -- this is our second year. Last year we started this program with one teacher (myself) and seven students. This year we have 23 students in two classrooms with two teachers (myself and Kathleen Victory).

This is our first mini-grant award from the Rotary Club, and we are very grateful for their support. Last year, the Rotary Club chose our school site to fund the construction of an organic garden. The garden has been fantastic for our program. We are growing all kinds of vegetables and herbs to use in our cooking lessons at LIFT.



Students in the AUSD LIFT program open their new cash registers and role play real-life transactions. The Rotary Club of Alhambra Teacher Mini-Grant program funded the cash registers.

**Q: How have you used your mini-grant?**

A: We requested the grant to purchase two Sharp electronic cash registers, one for each classroom. The cash registers allow students to practice important vocational skills for future potential jobs, such as receiving payments for goods or services, issuing receipts, completing returns, making change, and counting money in the cash drawer. The cash registers also allow students to realistically role-play social skills such as greeting customers and customer service. Due to the nature of the disabilities served in the LIFT program, our students will have limited options of enrolling in most higher education or vocational programs. The cash registers provide students in our program an additional real-life tool in order to become independent, contributing members of the community.


