South Garfield Village Ribbon Cutting



The City of Monterey Park is pleased to announce the completion of the street improvements in the South Garfield Village area just north of the 60 Freeway. To facilitate these improvements, the City Council authorized the use of approximately \$900,000 in funding earmarked for economic development projects. The improvements included new street trees and decorative tree grates, landscaped median islands, a mid-block crossing and signal beacon, and bio-swales to address storm water runoff.

These upgrades have greatly improved the aesthetics and safety in the South Garfield Village area, a goal of the Specific Plan.

These enhancements in the village have also created a more pedestrian and business friendly environment. Over time, the village will grow and prosper.

The City of Monterey Park will be conducting a ribbon cutting ceremony in honor of these new improvements to the South Garfield Village on October 4 at 5 p.m. The ribbon cutting will take place on the west side of the street at the new crosswalk.

Monterey Park Police Warn of AT&T Phone Scam and Caller ID Spoofing

The Monterey Park Police Department is warning people about a "spoofing" cell phone scam that is going around asking for personal information.

the call and they said it was an AT&T verification and to push #1. They start asking personal questions, such as your social security number.

By its literal definition, to spoof is to:

1. Imitate something while exaggerating characteristic features for comic effect
2. Hoax or trick someone

As you can see, it can be pretty convincing and spoofing attempts may be on the rise.

So what can you do to better protect yourself?

Spoofing is also a term used when referring to phone and online frauds and scams. Scammers can change the number that appears on caller ID to trick you. The number could appear to be a government agency or a legitimate business. Or the number could look so much like yours that you think the call or text is from a friend or neighbor. It might even be your own number that appears to be calling you. The spoofer's goal is to get you to answer the phone or text, opening the door for a scam that asks for your personal or account information.

1. Always remember that caller ID spoofers are out there and you could be their next target.
2. Ignore incoming calls from numbers you do not readily recognize.
3. Don't give out personal information just because the caller asks for it, regardless of how simple the request may seem.
4. Hang up immediately if you suspect it's a spoofer. And don't try to outsmart the bad guy by intentionally giving out wrong information. Just hang up.
5. If the call could be from a person or company you know, tell the caller you'll get back to them and hang up. Call the entity using a phone number found from a trusted source, such as their secure website or your bill.
6. Report the call to the company or agency that supposedly contacted you.

We've heard from many of you about spoofing attempts. Here are a couple examples:

According to AT&T, you can report scams to abuse@att.net.

1. Getting calls from spoofed AT&T customer service number saying your account has been suspended and needs verification. There's no problem with your account and AT&T didn't call you, but it shows up on your caller ID as the legitimate AT&T number.
2. You have an account with AT&T. You receive a call on your cell phone showing your cell phone number and name. You answer

Monterey Park Environmental Commission Field Trip to CSULA Hydrogen Research Facility

The Monterey Park Environmental Commission conducted a field trip to California State University Los Angeles (CSULA) Hydrogen Research Facility and Fuel Station on July 27, 2018. The tour was hosted by the Director of the CSULA Hydrogen Research Center and was joined by the environmental commissioners, students from Mark Keppel High and Alhambra High Schools, residents of Alhambra and Monterey Park, a representative from BMW alternative fuel, and a hydrogen professor from Russia. The tour provided educational opportunities for the participants to learn more about hydrogen as an alternative fuel, the process technology, its applications in various industries and in the automobile industry, its potential market, and opportunities for the neighboring community like Monterey Park to take advantage of the potential applications from hydrogen fuel.

The hydrogen research facility was built in year 2014 and housed in the campus of California State University-Los Angeles. The facility is equipped with hydrogen fuel cell production area, one hydrogen fueling station with two fueling pumps, and three fuel cell vehicles in operations. The facility is one of the 36 hydrogen fueling stations of its kind in California. Its current production is 60 kg per day of hydrogen fuel. The facility crew is also part of the CSULA staff of the Engineering Department and instructors for the Engineering courses in hydrogen technology.

The concept of the hydrogen fuel making is principally through electricity + water in a controlled pressure. At the

CSULA hydrogen facility, the operation runs five days a week and eight hours per day to produce 60 kg of hydrogen gas (H2) fuel per day. Through high pressure compressors, around 6,000 psi (pounds per square inch) of the H2 gas is maintained in the storage tanks. The compressed H2 gas will then go through the Hydrogen Chiller to prevent it from overheating, before it is dispensed to the Hydrogen pump station. Hydrogen is a flammable chemical compound, hence, Pressure Relief Valves are installed and essential to control the gas volume in the tanks and for safety measures. The CSULA hydrogen facility also utilizes the Programmable Logic Controller (PLC) to monitor the H2 fuel production, its volumes, and all of the safety precautions. The two fueling pumps at the facility consist of a pump for regular passenger vehicle which operates at 10,000 psi (700 H2 Fill Bar) and the other pump for larger vehicle such as bus and trucks which operates at 5,000 psi (350 H2 Fill Bar). The time for hydrogen fueling takes about 5 to 10 minutes. The typical hydrogen fuel vehicle, also known as Fuel Cell Electric Vehicle (FCEV), can operate with 100 kW of electricity and speed up to 100 miles per hour, with distance range up to 250 miles per fill-up.

Presently, the hydrogen fuel market is priced at \$14 - \$16 per kg. There are as many as 5,000 hydrogen fuel cell vehicles now in the United States with more coming down the pipeline as the fuel production and market demand grow. The three major auto manufacturers that have been investing largely in the production of FCEVs include Toyota, Honda, and Hyundai. The public may have recognized some fuel

cell vehicles on the road such as Toyota Mirai, Honda Clarity, and Hyundai Tucson Fuel Cell. Other two car manufacturers that have also come along are Chevy Fuel Cell EV and Mercedes-Benz B-Class F-Cell. In the U.S., most of the FCEVs usage is operated for government vehicles, while the fuel cell infrastructure is continually built to support the public usage and market expansion of FCEV. In California specifically, the growth of fuel cell is pushed by the State mandate for renewable energy. Few other States also come along such as New York, Massachusetts, etc to expand the H2 fuel market. Worldwide in Europe, Germany leads the use of fuel cell production and the FCEV market. The leading European auto manufacturers for FCEV include Mercedes, Audi, and BMW.

The presence of CSULA Hydrogen Research Facility and Fuel Station in the San Gabriel Valley certainly brings benefits to the surrounding communities such as Monterey Park. While the fuel cell market is expanding and growing, it can benefit residents, business, and including our city to take advantage of the infrastructure growth in the greater San Gabriel Valley, the availability of the hydrogen fuel station in the close proximity to our community, and the availability of the Fuel Cell Electric Vehicles in the local auto dealers near Monterey Park. It is also a large benefit to the environment and our local economy as we strive towards the use of alternative fuels, renewable energy, cleaner vehicles, zero emissions, and small carbon footprint in the Monterey Park community.



Guide to the Night Sky

Fall is here. The days have been getting noticeably shorter while the nights are getting longer, as we head towards the winter solstice.

Back in early August, four planets were gracing our early evening skies: Venus - low in the west; Jupiter - high in the south; Saturn - climbing higher in the south east; and Mars - rising in the south east at sunset. This month, Venus (in Libra then heading into Virgo) is becoming lost in the glare of the setting sun; Jupiter (in Libra the Scales) is low in the south west; Saturn (in Sagittarius the Archer) is high in the south west at sunset; and Mars (in Capricornus the Sea Goat) is not too far behind Saturn, high in the south-southeast at sunset.

For October, two planets will be great for naked eye viewing: Saturn and Mars. Mars will be the brighter of the two with a subtle orangey hue, while Saturn appears to the west of Mars as an average, non twinkling "star." As always, the moon travels the night sky with each of the planets, making the visible ones very easy to spot - but only on a particular evening as the moon is in constant motion around Earth.

On October 11, look for Jupiter just below a thin crescent moon, low in the southwest.

On October 14, the moon will have moved east to the point where it will travel the night sky with Saturn. In fact, the lower "point" of the thicker crescent moon will appear to almost be "touching" the quintessential ringed gas giant.

Three days later, on October 17, the moon is to the right of the subtly reddish/orangey Mars, while the next evening, October 18, the moon appears to the left of "The God of War."

On October 24, the moon has moved east to the point where it is directly opposite the Sun and as a result, appears full. This month's full moon is known as "The Full Hunter's Moon," since it was this time of year that ancient tribes began the annual hunt to prepare for the soon to be coming winter.

Speaking of the coming winter, this is also the time of year when some recognizable constellations start to rise in the east prior to midnight. As Earth continues her constant journey orbiting our nearest star, The Sun, at night time - when we are facing out into space - we see different patterns of stars, different times of the year. Long ago, our ancestors used the seasonally shifting and changing constellations as a sort of calendar. By watching the sky, they knew when to prepare for the winter, when it was time to plant crops, when the rains were coming, when to harvest... the sky gave them access to information that was vital to survival. Today, this same astronomical information is just as beneficial to us. By month's end, Taurus the Bull and Orion the Hunter, both winter constellations, appear low in the east just before midnight, signaling that winter is on its way. Taurus is not as easy to spot as Orion, but one of its more identifiable "asterisms" (a grouping of stars that is not a constellation) is the Pleiades, (PLEE-uh-dees), which appears as a small and faint grouping of stars rising prior to the "V" shape of stars that make up the Bull's face. The Pleiades, also known as the Seven Sisters (and used as the Subaru logo), is often confused, by some, as The Little Dipper, and almost resembles a very tiny tennis racket. Look for this cluster of stars, due east after 11 p.m. in late October - and the darker the sky, the better chance you will have to see it. Keep in mind that as Earth continues to move around the Sun, these stars, asterisms and constellations will rise earlier and earlier until, just before spring, they are close to the western horizon at sunset, so you will have plenty of time this fall and winter to check them out.

As always, thanks for reading and remember...keep looking up.

La Policía de Monterey Park advierte sobre estafas telefónicas de AT&T y la Falsificación del Identificador de llamadas

El Departamento de Policía de Monterey Park está advirtiendo a la gente sobre una estafa de “falsificación” de teléfono celular que se está usando para pedir su información personal.

La definición literal de “spoof” (engañar, imitar, falsificar) es:

1. Imitar algo mientras que se exageran las características para causar un efecto cómico
2. Engaño o estafar a alguien “Spoofing” (falsificación) es también un término usado cuando se refieren a fraudes y estafas telefónicas y en línea. Los estafadores pueden cambiar el número que aparece en el identificador de llamadas para engañarlo a usted. El número podría parecer el de una agencia gubernamental o de un negocio legítimo. O el número podría ser muy parecido al suyo que lo hace pensar que la llamada o texto es de un amigo o vecino. Incluso podría ser su propio número el que parece llamarlo.

El objetivo del “spoofing” (falsificador) es lograr que usted conteste el teléfono o texto, abriendo así la puerta para una estafa que pide su información personal o de su cuenta.

Hemos escuchado de muchos de ustedes sobre intentos de falsificaciones. Aquí hay un par de ejemplos:

1. Recibir llamadas de un número del servicio al cliente de AT&T falsificado, diciendo que su cuenta ha sido suspendida y necesita verificación. No hay ningún problema con su cuenta y AT&T no lo llamó, pero aparece en su identificador de llamadas como un número legítimo de AT&T.
2. Usted tiene una cuenta con AT&T. Recibe una llamada en su teléfono celular que muestra el número de su teléfono celular y su nombre. Usted contesta la llamada y ellos le dicen que es una verificación de

AT&T y que presione el #1. Empiezan a hacerle preguntas personales, como su número del Seguro Social.

Como puede usted ver, pueden ser bastante convincentes y los intentos de falsificación pueden estar aumentando.

Entonces, ¿que puede hacer para protegerse mejor?

1. Siempre recuerde que los falsificadores del identificador de llamadas están por ahí y usted podría ser su próximo objetivo.
2. Ignore las llamadas de números que no reconoce fácilmente.
3. No dé su información personal sólo porque la persona que llama lo pide, a pesar de lo sencillo que pueda parecer el pedido.
4. Cuelgue inmediatamente si usted sospecha que es un falsificador. Y no intente ser más vivo que el tipo malo dándole intencionalmente información errónea. Sólo cuelgue.
5. Si la llamada pudiera ser de una persona o compañía que usted conoce, dígame al que llama que usted lo llamará y cuelgue. Llame a la entidad usando un número de teléfono que ha encontrado en una fuente de confianza, como su sitio web seguro o su factura.
6. Reportar la llamada a la compañía o agencia que supuestamente se puso en contacto con usted.

De acuerdo con AT&T, usted puede reportar las estafas a abuse@att.net.

蒙特利公園警察局發出警告通知AT&T電話公司電話詐騙及電話顯示器號碼詐騙

蒙特利公園警察局發出警告,關於手機電話詐騙企圖,欺騙尋求個人的信息。根據其字面定義,欺騙是:

1. 模仿及誇大的效果來騙人
2. 騙人或欺騙他人

在電話及網路上欺詐和詐騙時使用的術語。詐騙者可以更改電話顯示器上的號碼來欺騙您。顯示器上的號碼似乎是政府機構或合法企業,或號碼看起來和你平常接到的一樣,你認為電話或短信來自朋友或鄰居,它甚至可能是您自己的號碼在呼喚您。

詐騙者的目的是讓你接聽電話或短信,這樣就有機會,便詢問你的個人帳戶信息。我們從很多人那裡聽說過詐騙集團的企圖。以下是幾個例子:

1. 接到詐騙性的AT&T電話公司客戶服務號碼的電話,說您的帳戶已被暫停並需要驗證。其實您的帳戶沒有任何問題,AT&T電話公司也並沒有給您打電話,但電話顯示器的號碼是顯示著AT&T電話公司號碼。
2. 你有AT&T電話公司的賬號。您在手機上接到一個電話,顯示了您的手機號碼和姓名。當你接聽電話,他們說這是一個AT&T電話公司驗證工能,並要求您按#1。他們就開始會問您的個人信息,例如您的社會安全號碼。正如您所看到的,他們非常有說服力,詐騙行為案件一直在上升中。

那麼你能做些什麼防衛動作來保護自己呢?

1. 永遠記住電話顯示騙局一直存在,你將有可能成為他們的下一個目標。
2. 請不要接聽您不認識的號碼。
3. 不管他人的請求聽起來多麼簡單,不要僅僅因為來電者的要求您就提供您個人信息。
4. 如果你懷疑它是一個詐騙者,請立即掛斷。並且不要試圖故意給不正確信息來顯示自己比詐騙者聰明。把電話掛斷就好。
5. 如果電話可能來自您認識的人或公司,請告訴來電者您將回復並掛斷電話。請用您受信任的來源(例如其官方網站或帳單)中找到的公司電話號碼。
6. 把詐騙性的來電舉報給據稱與您聯繫的公司或代理機構。

根據AT&T電話公司的說法,您可以將詐騙集團的信息提供報告給 abuse@att.net。
