New Voting Solutions for All People (VSAP)

The Los Angeles County Registrar Recorder's Office is working on a new voting system for the March 2020 Presidential Primary Election and beyond. The new system will allow registered voters to cast their ballot at any vote center location in Los Angeles County. You will no longer have to go to your designated polling place. Voters will be able to obtain their ballot at any vote center location in the County.

The Vote Center Placement Project (VCP) has started conducting community meetings. The Los Angeles County Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk has partnered with Community Based Organizations to host and facilitate 33 meetings across the County through January 2019.

The public is invited to learn about the VSAP program and provide input on recommended Vote Center locations and suggest additional sites in their own community and countywide.

There will be two (2) community meetings to discuss possible locations for the City of Monterey Park.

Holiday Tree and Lighting Safety Tips from the Monterey Park Fire Department

The Monterey Park Fire Department hopes everyone will enjoy a joyous holiday season. However, it is always of importance to stress the need to be aware of certain safety hazards that are associated with the holiday season. The following tips will help keep you and your family safe as we pass through yet another holiday season and ring in the New Year.

Tree Fire Hazards

Special fire safety precautions need to be taken when keeping a tree in the house. A burning tree can rapidly fill a room with fire and deadly gases.

Tree Selection, Care and Disposal

Needles on fresh trees should be green and hard to pull back from the branches, and the needles should not break if the tree has been freshly cut. The trunk should be sticky to the touch. Old trees can be identified by bouncing the tree trunk on the ground. If many needles fall off, the tree has been cut too long, has probably dried out, and is a fire hazard.

Do not place your tree close to a heat source, including a fireplace or heat vent. Heat will dry out the tree, causing it to be more easily ignited by heat, flame or sparks. Be careful not to drop or flick cigarette ashes near a tree. Do not put your live tree up too early or leave it up for longer than two weeks. Keep the tree stand filled with water at all times. Consider using a potted tree.

Never put tree branches or needles in a fireplace or wood burning stove. When the tree becomes dry, discard it promptly.

Holiday Lights

Inspect holiday lights each year for frayed wires, bare spots, gaps in the insulation, broken or cracked sockets, and excessive kinking or wear before putting them up. Use only lighting listed by an approved testing laboratory. If there is any question as to the integrity of your lights, replace them with a new set of lights. Do not leave holiday lights on while unattended.

Do not overload electrical outlets

Follow the directions on the light sets when connecting your lights. Connect lights to an extension cord before plugging the cord into the outlet. Make sure to periodically check the wires - they should not be warm to the touch.

Decorations

All decorations should be nonflammable or flame retardant and placed away from heat vents. Never put wrapping paper in a fireplace. Wrapping paper can produce dangerous sparks and a chemical buildup in the home that could cause an explosion.

Artificial Christmas Trees

If you are using a metallic or artificial tree, make sure it is flame retardant.

Follow Your Gut Instinct and the "Five-Second Rule," Don't Delay, Call Right Away

Don't delay in calling the police department - report it immediately. Remember the "five-second rule"

The Monterey Park Police Department would like to remind everyone in our community to report suspicious activity right away.

Many of us, since we were young children, have heard about the "five-second rule" If you dropped food on the floor and picked it up within five seconds, it was okay to eat. From that childhood tale, researchers have found that, if the moment you feel an instinct to act on a goal or a commitment, you take some action towards it within five seconds, you will have a greater chance of achieving it.

The Monterey Park Police Department has adopted both concepts in our message to the community regarding reporting suspicious activity. We have used the term, "If you see something,

say something" for many years. We continue to remind people of that, but we're adding to it the "five-second rule." When you have that gut instinct that what you are observing is suspicious, you should act on it and call the police, within five seconds. This way you will act on it quickly helping to get a quicker response from police.

If there is an emergency situation in which someone needs immediate help, dial 9-1-1. To report suspicious activity that may not be an emergency situation, call our non-emergency line at 626-573-1311. Describe specifically what you observed, including who or what you saw, when you saw it, where it occurred, and why it's suspicious. We all play a role in keeping our communities safe. Let's all do our part.

CREATION OF A CITY COUNCIL DISTRICT-BASED ELECTORAL SYSTEM PURSUANT TO ELECTIONS CODE SECTION 10010

Public Hearings will be held to receive community input on district boundaries and maps for the formation of City Council districts for elections commencing with the General Municipal Election in March 2020. The City Council will discuss, consider, and take action on one or more district map(s). The City Council's actions may include modification of district boundaries, sequencing of elections, introduction



Guide to the Night Sky

Here we are at the end of 2018 and this month brings us important changes to our night sky. The most influential event of the month is happening on December 21 at 2:09 p.m., and that, my friends, is the winter solstice.

Ever since June 21 of this year, our nearest star, the Sun, has been slowly making its way south - rising and setting a little further south each and every day, simultaneously shortening our days and increasing our nights. This month, on December 21, the Sun will rise and set at the most furthest point south. This marks not only the first day of winter, but what is usually the shortest day and the longest night of the year. Then, on the next day, December 22nd, the Sun will gradually start to head north again, increasing our amount of daylight and decreasing our evening hours.

Winter's first full moon occurs this month as well. On December 22, we will be treated to The Full Cold Moon.

Ancient tribes also referred to this month's full moon as "The Long Night's Moon," since December's full moon always corresponds with the longest night of the year. The Moon will be officially full at 9:50 a.m., though it will appear full the night before, during (of course) and the night after.

The Moon will also share the sky with some of the more prominent and visible planets. For early risers, look to the east on the morning of December 3. Low on the horizon (and weather permitting), you will see the brilliant planet Venus just below a thin, waning, crescent moon. On the evening of December 14, look for the first quarter (or half full) moon traveling the night sky below the dimming, but still bright, planet Mars.

And speaking of planets, this year was a great year for viewing Venus, Jupiter, Saturn and Mars. As 2018 comes to an end, the only planet easily visible in our evening skies is Mars, the God of War. Saturn has moved so close to the glare of the

setting sun that it's difficult to spot. Jupiter is making its way towards the glare of the Sun as well, making it impossible to see from Earth. Both of these gas giants will eventually pass to the other side of the Sun and will be visible in our early, pre-dawn skies, but we'll have to wait a few months for that to happen.

In the meantime, have a safe and wonderful holiday season, and remember...keep looking up!





蒙特利公園消防局的聖誕樹和照明安全提示

蒙特利公園消防局希望每個人都能享受一個歡樂的假期。然而，強調提高假日季節相關的安全隱患意識始終是很重要的。以下提示將幫助您和您的家人安全度過又一個假期，迎接新的一年。

樹火災害

在家裡擺放聖誕樹時，需要採取特殊的防火安全措施。一顆燃燒的樹木會讓火災迅速在房間內蔓延，致命的氣體充滿整個房間。

樹木選擇，護理和處置

新鮮樹木上的樹尖應該是綠色的，很難從樹枝上拔下來，而且不會折斷，如果樹木是新鮮剛被割下的。樹幹用手摸的話應該是粘性的。老樹可以通過在地面上彈跳樹幹來識別，如果許多樹尖脫落，就表明樹木被切斷的時間太長，可能已經乾枯，並將是一種火災隱患。

不要將樹放在靠近熱源的地方，包括壁爐或散熱孔。熱量會使樹木變乾，使其更容易被熱，火焰或火花點燃。注意不要在樹木附近扔香煙灰或彈煙灰。不要過早地放置活樹，也不要將它放置超過兩週以上。始終保持樹架充滿水。考慮使用盆栽樹。

切勿將樹枝或樹尖放入壁爐或燃木爐中。當樹變乾後，請立即丟棄。

節日燈飾

每年檢查節日燈飾是否有磨損的電線，裸露出的點，絕緣間隙，破損或破裂的插座，以及在安裝之前是否過度扭結或磨損。僅使用經安全認可的測試實驗室測試合格通過的照明燈飾。如果對你的燈的標準有任何疑問，請選擇用一套新的燈飾替換它們。在無人看管時不要打開節日燈。

不要使電源插座超載

連接燈時請按照燈組上的說明進行操作。在將電源線插入插座之前，將燈連接到延長電源線。確保定期檢查電線 - 觸摸時不應該燙手。

裝飾品

所有裝飾品都應是不易燃或阻燃的，並遠離熱通風口。切勿將包裝紙放入壁爐中。包裝紙會在家中產生危險的火花，形成化學物質，可能會引起爆炸。

人造聖誕樹

如果您使用的是金屬或人造樹，請確保它是阻燃的。

遵循你的直覺和“五秒規則”，不要拖延，立即打電話

不要拖延打電話給警察局 - 立即報告。記住“五秒規則”

蒙特利公園市警察局想提醒我們社區的每個人，立即報告任何的可疑活動。

很多人從小都聽說過“五秒規則” - 如果你把食物掉在了地板上，但在五秒鐘內撿起來，還是可以吃的。從這個童年的故事中，研究人員發現，如果你感到有本能去實現一個目標或一個承諾，你在五秒鐘內就會採取一些行動，那麼你就有更大的機會實現它。

Consejos sobre Seguridad para los Árboles y las Luces de Navidad del Departamento de Bomberos de Monterey Park

El Departamento de Bomberos de Monterey Park espera que todos disfruten de una temporada feliz navideña. Sin embargo, siempre es importante recalcar la necesidad de estar al tanto de ciertos peligros de seguridad que se asocian con la temporada navideña. Los siguientes consejos les ayudará a mantener seguros a usted y a su familia mientras pasamos por otra temporada navideña y celebramos el Año Nuevo.

Peligro de Incendio de los Árboles de Navidad

Se necesita tomar precauciones especiales de seguridad contra incendios cuando se mantiene un árbol en la casa. Un árbol en llamas puede llenar una habitación rápidamente con fuego y gases mortíferos.

Selección, Cuidado y Disposición del Árbol

Las agujas de los árboles frescos deben ser verdes y difíciles de sacar de las ramas, y las agujas no se deben romper si el árbol ha sido recién cortado. El tronco se debe estar pegajoso al tacto. Los árboles viejos pueden ser identificados rebotando el tronco del árbol en el suelo. Si caen muchas agujas, el árbol ha sido cortado hace mucho tiempo, probablemente se ha secado, y es un peligro de incendio.

No ponga su árbol cerca de una fuente de calor, incluyendo una chimenea ni un conducto de ventilación de la calefacción. El calor secará el árbol, haciéndolo más fácil de prenderse con el calor, la llama o las chispas. Cuidado de no dejar caer ni salpicar cenizas de cigarrillos cerca de un árbol. No ponga su árbol vivo demasiado temprano ni lo utilice por más de dos semanas. Mantenga el soporte del árbol lleno de agua en todo momento. Considere el uso de un árbol en maceta.

Nunca ponga ramas del árbol o agujas en la chimenea o estufa de leña. Cuando el árbol se seque, deséchelo rápidamente.

Luces Navideñas

Inspeccione las luces navideñas cada año para ver si hay alambres desgastados, partes descubiertas, separaciones en el aislamiento, enchufes rotos o agrietados, y desgaste excesivo antes de colgarlas. Utilice sólo las luces indicadas por un laboratorio de pruebas aprobados. Si tiene alguna duda en cuanto a la integridad de sus luces, reemplácelas con un nuevo juego de luces. No deje las luces navideñas encendidas mientras están desatendidas.

No sobrecargue los enchufes de electricidad

Siga las instrucciones de los juegos de luces cuando conecte sus luces. Conecte las luces a un cable de extensión antes de enchufar el cable en la toma de corrientes. Asegúrese de revisar periódicamente los cables - No deben estar calientes al tacto.

Decoraciones

Todas las decoraciones deben ser inflamables o resistentes al fuego y colocadas lejos de los conductos de ventilación de la calefacción. Nunca ponga papel de envolver en una chimenea. El papel de envolver puede producir chispas peligrosas y una acumulación química en el hogar que podría causar una explosión.

Árboles de Navidad Artificiales

Si usted está usando un árbol metálico o artificial, asegúrese de que es resistente al fuego.

Siga su Instinto y la “Regla de los cinco segundos,” No se Demore, Llame inmediatamente

No se demore en llamar al Departamento de Policía - repórtelo inmediatamente. Recuerde la “regla de los cinco segundos”

El Departamento de Policía de Monterey Park quisiera recordarles a todos en nuestra comunidad que reporten actividades sospechosas inmediatamente.

Muchos de nosotros, desde que éramos niños pequeños, hemos oído hablar de la “regla de los cinco segundos” - Si dejó caer comida en el suelo y la recogió dentro de cinco segundos, estaba bien comerla. De ese cuento de la niñez, los investigadores han descubierto que, si en el momento que usted siente un instinto de actuar en una meta o compromiso, usted toma alguna acción dentro de cinco segundos, usted tendrá una mayor probabilidad de lograrlo.

El Departamento de Policía de Monterey Park ha adoptado ambos conceptos en nuestro mensaje a la comunidad con respecto a reportar actividades sospechosas. Hemos usado el término, “Si ves algo, di algo” durante muchos años.
