Be Prepared For and Assist the Monterey Park Community During a Disaster

Apply now for the next CERT session occurring April 4-7 (Thursday-Sunday), 9 a.m.-5 p.m. daily.

Deadline to apply is March 20, 2019



The City of Monterey Park Fire and Police Departments are prepared for all types of emergencies. However, during a disaster, the number and scope of incidents can overwhelm conventional emergency services. To

assist members of the community to be prepared during a disaster and to learn how to assist others, the Monterey Park Fire Department is sponsoring the Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) program.

The CERT program is an all-risk, all hazard training course for members of the community. This valuable course is designed to help you protect yourself, your family, your neighbors and your neighborhood in an emergency situation.

It is about readiness, people helping people, rescuer safety and doing the greatest good for the greatest number. CERT is a positive and realistic approach to emergency and disaster situations where citizens may initially be on their own and their actions can make a difference. While people will respond to others in need without the training, one goal of the CERT program is to help our residents do so effectively and efficiently without being placed in unnecessary danger.

Apply Now for the Spring 2019 Session

The spring CERT class will be four consecutive eight hour sessions on April 4-7, 2019 which will include a disaster simulation drill. The training course is free to residents of Monterey Park and consists of:

- Utilities: Learning how and where to turn off gas meters, electricity and water service if leaking or broken pipes are detected.
- Putting out small fires using an extinguisher.
- Certification on CPR and first aid.
- Helping triage victims by controlling bleeding, treating for shock and providing basic medical aid.
- Organizing yourself and volunteers to be effective towards aiding victims.
- Collecting disaster intelligence to support first responder efforts.

The deadline to apply is March 20, 2019. Applications are available on the city website or in person at Fire Station 61 next to city hall at 350 W. Newmark Avenue, Monterey Park, CA 91754. 



Monterey Park Announces New Parade Route

New parade route and new name planned for 2019. City encouraging community groups to participate in the parade



The City of Monterey Park will host its annual birthday celebration (also known as Play Days) with a weekend of carnival rides, game booths, entertainment and concessions from Thursday, May 9 to Sunday, May 12, 2019 at Barnes Park.

The annual birthday parade will be held on Saturday, May 11, 2019, beginning at 11:00 a.m. along a new parade route. The parade will feature school marching bands, classic automobiles, community organizations, equestrians, military units, floats, performers and VIPs.

Planning for the parade is well underway in its new location. The parade route has been moved west and there will be temporary detours and "No Parking" zones during the event.

As the map shows, the parade will begin at the intersection of Ramona Ave. at Newmark Ave., and proceeds north to Garvey Ave., west to Chandler Ave., south to Newmark Ave., then east, concluding at McPherrin Ave. at Barnes Park at the birthday carnival. Parking will not be allowed along the parade route and in select surrounding areas from 7:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. Please note that during the course of the parade the primary north-south transportation routes will be Atlantic Blvd. and Garfield Ave., and east-west route will be Emerson Ave.

The City of Monterey Park is seeking community participation and entries in the parade. Schools, youth and service organizations, teams, businesses, associations, and clubs are encouraged to participate in the parade and show their Monterey Park spirit. Regular Meeting of January 16, 2019

The meeting was called to order at 7:03 p.m., with all council members present.

Agenda Item 2-A. Director of Public Works McAvoy introduced Frank A. Lopez, the new Assistant City Engineer. Assistant City Engineer Lopez briefly introduced himself along with his experience and goals for the city.

Agenda Item 2-B. Director of Recreation & Community Services Alvarez presented a promotional video, created in partnership with Modern Business, intended to build awareness about the city’s economic opportunities for potential businesses.

Agenda Item 2-C. City Manger Bow presented an update on the Monterey Park Market Place regarding parking, new businesses, and the traffic flow.

Agenda Item 2-D. City Manger Bow presented an update on the 710 Freeway stating that the Metropolitan Transportation Authority (MTA) along with California Transportation (CalTrans) has deemed the project, which would have connected the 710 Freeway to the 210 Freeway, unfeasible.

The Alhambra Day Nursery Foundation (ADN) will be giving approximately one hundred thousand dollars in financial grants and scholarships to individuals and organizations residing or working within the boundaries of the Alhambra Unified School District. Applications will be available beginning February 1, 2019 and are due by March 15, 2019.

ADN was founded in 1943 by a group of women in the Alhambra community with the mission of assisting working mothers with childcare during WWII. After the war, the organization continued to assist the community by providing childcare and pre-school programs in cooperation with the Alhambra School District. Thirteen years ago, ADN changed its' mission to: "providing financial grants to individuals and organizations working with children, and scholarships to students graduating from local high schools or local students attending college with majors in childhood education or related fields".

Financial Grant applications will be accepted for consideration from individuals or groups for projects involving children living within the boundaries of the Alhambra school district, which encompasses all of Alhambra, parts of Monterey Park, San Gabriel and Rosemead. Projects must show evidence of enriching the lives and wellbeing of children through education and be a "not for profit" program. In the past, grants have been awarded to teachers, schools, the YMCA, Girls Scouts, and others. Grant applications may be requested by e-mail from Ed Aguirre, grant coordinator, at eoaguirre@aol.com or by calling Aguirre at 626-943-3080. Completed applications must be submitted by March 15, 2019. Successful applicants will be notified in early May and the awarded funds will be available shortly thereafter.

The Foundation is also offering scholarships to graduating seniors from high schools within the school district boundaries in the amount of \$1,000. Applicants must



show an interest in early childhood education or related fields of study. Students continuing their college/university studies in early childhood education or related fields may reapply to qualify for a second year \$1,000 scholarship or \$2,000 for the third and fourth year of advanced studies. First year applicants must: have a minimum G.P.A. of 2.5 throughout high school; submit a letter(s) of recommendation and a personal goal statement; and complete the scholarship application. Individuals, already enrolled in a college/ university program, who graduated from a local school or live within the school district boundaries may apply as a new applicant. Guide to the Night Sky

March brings the return of spring to the Northern Hemisphere with the annual vernal equinox

On Wednesday, March 20 at approximately 2:58 p.m., spring will officially begin, while our neighbors below the equator in the Southern Hemisphere will simultaneously be celebrating the return of autumn. On this day, both the Northern and Southern Hemispheres will receive equal amounts of daylight and darkness, hence the term equinox, which is Latin for equal night. Back in December, ever since the winter solstice, the Sun has been gradually making its way northward. On the equinoxes, the Sun rises due east and sets due west, right in the middle (equidistant) between the rising and setting locations of the Sun during the solstices. After this day however, the amount of daylight becomes greater than the amount of night time, as the Sun continues its journey northward and the days continue to get longer until June 21, the summer solstice.

March 20 not only ushers in the vernal (or spring) equinox but also this month's full moon. The full moon in March is known as the Full Worm Moon. This is the time of the year when the ground begins to soften and the earth worm casts reappear, inviting the return of the Robin - a true sign of spring. As always, the Moon appears full because it is opposite the Sun relative to Earth, therefore we see the entire face of the Moon illuminated, rather than just a sliver

or part of it. The Moon being opposite the Sun (or full) also means it rises in the east when the Sun is setting in the west.

And as always, the Moon travels the sky with several planets this month. Early risers will be treated to Venus, Jupiter and Saturn in the pre-dawn skies, while early evening star gazers will be able to view The God of War, Mars. On the morning of March 1 at about 5:00 a.m., look towards the southeast to see Venus, Saturn, the waning crescent moon and Jupiter all lined up in a diagonal line stretching from low in the east to high in the southeast. Venus, The Goddess of Beauty and Love, is the lowest and brightest, Jupiter, The Roman King of the Gods, will be the highest and second brightest, while Saturn (the God of Agriculture and the farthest naked eye planet) will be less spectacularly bright and just to the left of the Moon. The following morning however, the waning crescent moon slips further east and travels the sky to the right of Venus. In the early evening hours of March 11, look to the southwest for faint, reddish Mars to the right of the young waxing crescent moon. Towards month's end, the Moon has continued its monthly orbit around our planet and will line up with Jupiter and Saturn again. In the pre-dawn skies of March 26, look for bright Jupiter to the left

and slightly below the waning gibbous moon. If you miss it, don't fret - the next morning, March 27, you can see the Moon on the other side of Jupiter, just slightly below and to the left of the Roman King of the Gods. The morning after that, the Moon, continuing its journey eastward through the sky, pairs up with the faint but quintessential Saturn, whose spectacular ring system makes it a favorite of just about everyone. Look for Saturn just below and to the left of the Moon before sunrise on March 28, while on the 29th, the Moon has slipped past Saturn and now travels the pre-dawn skies to the left of the distant wanderer....


Enjoy all the night sky has to offer, and remember, keep looking up.


