Birthday Celebration Parade Features New Route for 2019

The City of Monterey Park will host its annual birthday celebration (also known as Play Days) with a weekend of carnival rides, game booths, entertainment and concessions from Thursday, May 9 to Sunday, May 12, 2019 at Barnes Park.


The annual birthday parade will be held on Saturday, May 11, 2019, beginning at 11 a.m. along a new parade route. The parade will feature school marching bands, classic automobiles, community organizations, equestrians, military units, floats, performers and VIPs. All children watching the parade will receive a free popsicle!

Planning for the parade is well underway in its new location. The parade route has been moved west and there will be temporary detours and "No Parking" zones during the event.

As the map shows, the parade will begin at the intersection of Ramona Ave. at Newmark Ave., and proceeds north to Garvey Ave., west to Chandler Ave., south to Newmark Ave., then east, concluding at McPherrin Ave. at Barnes Park at the birthday carnival. Parking will not be allowed along the parade route and in select surrounding areas from 7 a.m. to 3 p.m. Please note that during the course of the parade the primary north-south transportation routes will be

Atlantic Blvd. and Garfield Ave., and east-west route will be Emerson Ave.


National Public Works Week Open House May 21

Blue Trash Barrels: What and Who Are They For?

Short answer: they're for multi-family unit recycling

To comply with the state's mandatory commercial recycling legislation Mandatory Commercial Recycling (AB 341) and Mandatory Commercial Organics Recycling (AB 1826), Athens Services has provided customers with blue 96 gallon barrel recycling containers free of charge to multi-family complexes with five or more units. As a friendly reminder, these containers are serviced weekly on Thursdays. Please be reminded that property owners or tenants will need to bring the barrels out to the curb for service and return them to the enclosure after the barrels are emptied. Property owners may be cited by City of Monterey Park personnel if barrels are not removed from the curbside after collection.

It should be noted that these blue barrels are for recyclables only, not trash. Any contamination will result in refusal of service if identified by Athens Services drivers in order to avoid a contaminated truck load. The city appreciates residents' cooperation in being better recyclers and environmental stewards. If you wish to have additional containers, please contact Athens Services at 888-336-6100. April Showers Bring More Than Flowers

Mow high grasses and trim overgrown vegetation to avoid receiving a code enforcement notice



The City of Monterey Park Code Enforcement Division has received numerous complaints daily regarding overgrown vegetation and high grass. The city understands that, due to the excessive rains we have experienced these past few months, some owners and tenants have not been able to schedule a time to mow their lawns.

Now that the weather is warming up, the code enforcement division is asking that residents substantially cut and trim any dead or dried weeds, high grass and overgrown vegetation in order to avoid receiving a notice of violation or citation with a fine of \$100, \$250, \$500 or \$1,000.

Our code enforcement volunteers will also be posting courtesy notices to those properties that are unsightly and constitute a public nuisance.

What Does Monterey Park Have in Common with Grand Canyon National Park?

Both places recently celebrated their centennial year -- Monterey Park on May 29, 2016 and Grand Canyon National Park on February 26, 2019.

An article in the Monterey Park Progress in May of 1919 recorded the early history of this city. "It is difficult to write any article without using the name Garvey. There is Garvey Avenue, Garvey School, Garvey playground, Garvey Water System, Garvey Hills and Garvey Ranch. Richard Garvey first settled on the land along these foothills, building the first water system in this part of the country. He built the first school and laid out the first subdivision." Richard Garvey was the first pioneer who came to improve conditions for local residents, but he was not the last.

Charles and Laura Scudder moved to a strategic location in Monterey Park, just seven miles from downtown Los Angeles, at the corner of Atlantic and Garvey Avenues, in 1919, afterward establishing the first all-steel service station in the San Gabriel Valley. Laura had paid close attention to the advertising prowess found at Philadelphia's famous John Wanamaker Department Store when she worked there before moving west. Mr. Wanamaker was one of the first to use widespread newspaper advertising.

During the Great Depression, Laura would buy a billboard for only \$8.00 per month. She knew that you could have the best product in the country, but if nobody knows about it, you won't be successful. Laura's advertising for their service station read: "To Those Who Want To Know Where We Are, You'll Find Us at the Front Door of Monterey Park - Gasoline 17 cents per gallon." Many of you will remember Laura Scudder as the Potato Chip Queen.

Laura's grandson, John Scudder, designed and implemented a complete remodel of the Scudder exhibit in the Historical Museum in 2015. It is user friendly and appeals to all ages. Laura Scudder had an appreciation for nature and the new exhibit features a large photograph of Laura astride a mule on Bright Angel Trail in Grand Canyon National Park during the 1930s.

The Grand Canyon has a pre-history that dates back millions of years. John Wesley Powell led the first US government expedition of the Grand Canyon by boat in 1869. He was a one-armed Civil War soldier who dared to explore the Colorado River when all others by-passed that challenge. The history of man's explorations of the Grand Canyon in search of precious minerals has been extensively documented and was largely unsuccessful. The value of the canyon is not in how man can change the canyon, but how man can be changed by the canyon. "The canyon with its hypnotic layers of sandstone, shale and limestone carved out a mile deep, up to 16 miles wide and 277 miles long by the snaking snow-fed Colorado River is a national treasure that commands reflection. However you experience it, the park is bound to live up to its name," Westways magazine wrote.

The Monterey Park Historical Society thanks Mr. Scudder for the superb remodel recently completed in the Gribble Room at the Historical Museum. The museum is located at Garvey Ranch Park, 781 S. Orange Avenue, Monterey Park, CA 91755, and open Saturday-Sunday from 2-4 pm.

Night Sky Report


Welcome to the nighttime sky for May. I'm David Nakamoto and I'll be taking over writing this series of articles from Tré Gibbs. I'm an aerospace engineer specializing in software development and systems integration. I've been an amateur astronomer for over 50 years, and an amateur scientist for as long. I have two telescopes to do night observing and I mainly do astrophotography. I've been a member of the Los Angeles Astronomical Society (LAAS) since 1989, participating in its activities since the mid '80s. The LAAS operates the Garvey Ranch Park observatory, located just off the east parking lot, opening it for public viewing every Wednesday night around 7-10 p.m., weather permitting. There is an 8-inch refractor for visual observations, and a 4-inch refractor for imaging objects up in the sky. People often set up their own telescopes out on the lawn beside the observatory. If you have any questions on equipment, observing, or just want a peek through the observatory's scopes, please feel free to drop on by.

Around 8 p.m., Mars is low in the west. It's pretty much gone for the rest of this year. It won't be large enough to observe, even in a telescope, until the year 2020. To the eye, it's 400x smaller than the moon, about the size of a small crater on the moon as seen through a telescope.

All the other planets grace the morning skies this month. Around 3 a.m., Jupiter is directly south, the brightest star there. Saturn is a lot fainter and halfway between Jupiter and the eastern horizon. Venus rises in the east around 5 a.m. all month long,

making it nearly impossible to observe. Mercury spends the month being too close to the Sun. Neptune and Uranus are also in the morning sky.

Monterey Park's Garvey Ranch Observatory gives excellent views of the Moon and planets through its 8-inch scope, along with some deep sky objects. The most visible objects are star clusters. They are part of the Milky Way Galaxy, and therefore are close and relatively bright. But, if conditions are favorable, there are other deep sky objects that might be visible through the Garvey Ranch scopes.



One possibility is Messier-51, known as M-51. Charles Messier, a French amateur astronomer, made this list in the early 1800s to avoid confusing these objects with the comets he wanted to find. M-51 is a spiral galaxy, but all that will be seen through the 8-unch scope is

the core, looking like a fuzzy star. We might see more with the camera on the 4-inch telescope. It's southwest of the star at the end of the handle of the Big Dipper. With an 8x50 finder, you will glimpse another star to the west, fainter than the end-handle star. Now form a triangle as shown, M51 is a faint glow or two at the imagined third point of the triangle.

Another possibility is M-3, a dense collection of stars known as a globular cluster, because it looks like a ball of stars. We might see some of this in the 8-inch, but again, the 4-inch should capture more with its camera. It's a little harder to find than M51. Go 5 degrees northwest of Arcturus along the line to the two stars of Canes Venatici, the two hunting dogs. That's about 1/3rd of the way to those two stars. To find Arcturus, use the old method of following the stars in the handle of the Big Dipper as they curl away from the bowl, then "arc to Arcturus."

The Los Angeles Astronomical Society meets at Monterey Park's Garvey Ranch Observatory every Wednesday night, rain or shine, from 7-10 p.m. All members are eager to answer your questions and let you have a peek through our 8" telescope, weather permitting. Feel free to contact us, we would love to see you there. 



While increasing their swimming capabilities, they are able to learn about the physical aspects of being a professional rescuer. Participants are also challenged mentally with a curriculum that encompasses all aspects of being a lifeguard by training in the American Red Cross Guard Start Program, including First Aid, CPR and Water safety Aide courses. Junior Lifeguard candidates will be able to assist at the pool in various programs once completing all 3 lessons to give them a chance to work alongside professional lifeguards and learn what it takes!

Brightwood and Repetto Schools Win 2019 Scholar Dollar Prizes

Two of 20 winning CA public schools, they will use their prize money for technology and a science lab

California's official college savings plan, Scholar Share 529, announced 20 winning public schools in its 2019 Scholar Dollar program. Schools won by garnering the most votes and receive awards ranging from \$5K to \$30K for programs aimed at enriching student lives both in and out of the classroom.

Brightwood School was one of three schools in Category E (901-1500 students), which each receive \$25K. Brightwood will use the prize to expand its use of technology in all curricular areas, recognizing the significant impact technology has on students' learning.


