22nd Annual Cherry Blossom Festival Ushers in Spring at Barnes Park

The Monterey Park Cherry Blossom Festival will celebrate its 22nd anniversary, ushering in spring once again on Saturday and Sunday, April 27 and 28 at Barnes Park.


The Cherry Blossom Festival is a free admission, two-day weekend event that draws people from all over the Southern California area to experience Japanese and Asian Pacific culture. The outdoor main stage program is packed with performances that range from classical Japanese dancing to vibrant taiko drumming, from contemporary music groups such as Local Mojo and Kokoro to exhibitions of martial arts and local high school performance groups. Among the exhibits featured in the Barnes Park gym are Ikebana flower arrangements, Japanese Kimekomi dolls, mochi (sweet rice cake) making and sushi making.

This year, we are pleased to have vocalist and former Miss O'ahu Yvette Nii join us on Saturday, April 28. Nii has toured internationally to Japan as part of the 4th of July USO tour for 2,000 troops headed to Afghanistan. Nii was part of

the original cast production of Disney's "Beauty and the Beast" in Honolulu as well as "Little Shop of Horrors" and was nominated for a Hawaii Music Award for her original composition, "Through Someone Else's Eyes." Her passion for songwriting and musical talent was recognized by the Grammy nominated, internationally renowned band Hiroshima, who asked her to tour and record with the group. While completing her West Coast dates, she recorded two of the bands classics, Roomful of Mirrors and Dada for their album "Legacy."

The Cherry Blossom Festival Marketplace features numerous vendors with merchandise having that unique Asian/Pacific Islander flair. In addition to a game area, the children's craft area makes this the perfect family affair. And, what is a festival without delicious food choices, ranging from teriyaki to the popular mochi desserts?

Cherry Blossom attendees can also avoid parking hassles by taking free shuttles from Langley Senior Center, and Ynez and Repetto elementary schools.

The Monterey Park Environmental Commission is hosting the 2019 Earth Day Festival on Saturday, April 27 at Barnes Park from 11 a.m.-2 p.m. The Earth Day Festival is a joint event with the Cherry Blossom Festival and will be held at Barnes Park on 350 S. McPherrin Ave., Monterey Park. In addition, the Earth Day Festival will be celebrated with Bike Ride events, which include the Family Ride and Hill Challenge Ride. The Earth Day Festival and the Bike Rides are sponsored by the San Gabriel Valley Municipal Water District and the SoCalGas Company, with contributions from Ware Disposal.



Competing against approximately 30 elementary and middle schools, Monterey Highlands' rookie teams Brainy Bots and Dream Team took first and second, respectively, at the FIRST (For Inspiration and Recognition of Science and Technology) LEGO League competition during the "Into Orbit" season at the Walnut Qualifier Tournament. The two teams were recognized at a February 19, 2019 council meeting for their success at the Walnut Qualifier and their participation in the Championship Tournament.

The Brainy Bots, with 5th and 6th grade members Gavin Chan, Keira Chan, Sonia Hinojosa, Nicholas Jung, Cesar Osorio, Kristine Sy and Justin Wong, were named Champions for best all-around team. They were also given the Judge's Award at the Blockhead Bash Rewind Tournament for their innovative solution of a smokeless incinerator to reduce and recycle trash onboard spacecraft.

The Dream Team, with 4th, 5th and 6th grade members Ethan Amaro, Raelene Aragon, Sarah Duong, Sophia Duong, Andrew Duran, Diego Ruiz, Alex Song and Gabrielle Wong placed first for Core Values, recognizing their inclusion and teamwork. "We had a lot of different personalities and some disagreements, but we were still able to work well together," said Dream Team member Ethan Amaro.

During the competition, the teams presented research on a physical or social problem faced by humans during long duration space exploration within our solar system and their proposed solution. The teams are judged on their project and solution, robot design and application of Core Values. The Core Values are FIRST philosophies encouraging participants to pursue discovery, innovation, inclusion, impact, teamwork and fun in the spirit of friendly competition. Members also built, designed, and programmed a robot using LEGO Mindstorms to complete a series of missions on a table top playing field. "It was fun building and programming our EV3 to complete missions," said Brainy Bot member Nicholas Jung. Even though the teams were new to programming, the students were still able to pull out with sixth and seventh highest robot performance scores at the tournament.

John Tong, who coached Highlands' previous team, mentored both the students and the parent volunteer coaches Kelly Tong, Alana Hinojosa, Alberto Ruiz and Lida Bao. "I loved that we were able to pique our students' interest in engineering and science and see their individual strengths complement each other as a team." "The students are working hard and looking forward to next season," said coach Kelly Tong.







The underdog at any competition, Mark Keppel High School's MKAM Dance Team — whose members never had a dance lesson until they joined the dance company at age 14 — against all odds, competed on NBC's World of Dance on March 10, 2019. The only all male high school dancers to ever appear on the show, MKAM won its duel and qualified for the next WOD round, chasing the \$1M prize. Air date to be announced.

None of the students, who among them speak Mandarin, Cantonese, Vietnamese, Japanese, Tagalog, Spanish, Korean, and English, ever had a dance lesson before they joined the MKHS MKAM Dance Company as 9th graders. Every other tween or teen competing on WOD (or any television show for that matter) is the product of years of dance studio training combined with home schooling on a set. The MKAM dancers raised the money for competitions and costumes with Boba Tea fundraisers.

The MKAM story is incredible determination in the face of considerable obstacles pays off in an unimaginably fairytale way. The students not only had to learn to dance (some of them were terrible), they had to continually negotiate with their parents who had envisioned their high school sons studying to become doctors or engineers, not dancers who had 25 hour-a-week practices. The World of Dance has swiftly changed the parents' thinking about their sons being on the MKAM Dance Team.

Each boy has a story. Paul Im, MKAM team Captain with the 4.2 GPA, was the worst dancer ever when he joined as a freshman. Now very clearly the best. Alan Angeles, fluent in Tagalog, is the dancer who is the Team Hair Cutter and charges \$5 a haircut. Nathan Cao who is of Chinese descent, but born in Honduras, who speaks better Spanish than Eric Moreno, the team member from Mexico.

MKHS Dance Arts Director Activate Arroyo is still another story. Never was a coach more aptly named. Thanks to Mr. Arroyo, Mark Keppel High School is one of only 13 high schools in the state of California to offer a weighted Honors Dance program.

The MKSH Dance Company is in a class by itself. Both MKAM and the MKHS Dance Team swept the March 15-16, 2019, West Coast Elite National Competition. The MKHS Dance Teams won three 2019 West Coast Elite Dance National Championships in the Large Male, Medium Female and Small Male categories. Large Male also won Top Overall Points and Best Showmanship. The MKHS Dance Team then won Top Overall Championship.

At the competition, a MKHS Dance Team Alum, now a talented photojournalist, followed the champions throughout the completion, as part of her photo essay on the inspiring drive of the immigrant community of the San Gabriel Valley. Watch for her award-winning work coming out soon.

Mark Keppel High School won a 2019 California Distinguished School designation for its Freshman Focus model program structure to increase 9th grade

engagement while creating a framework for college and career readiness, using data to track results.

For the second straight year, Century High School won the 2019 California Model Continuing High School for its programs to support all students in graduating. This award was announced at the same time the visiting WASC accreditation team was congratulating the school on its exceptional leadership and school staff who work with at-risk students.

AUSD Gateway to Success won a 2019 California Model SARB Award, the fifth time in ten years, for its programs supporting at-risk students facing foster care, homelessness, food insecurity, neglect, poverty, and depression to stay in school, helping them create more possibilities for success. Gateway reduced chronic absenteeism to 3.9% down in 2017-2018, from 6.9% 2016-2017.


