Monterey Park Earth Day Festival, Eco-Summit and Bike Rides 2019

The Monterey Park Environmental Commission hosted the Earth Day Festival, Bike Rides, and Eco-Summit on April 27, 2019. The one day event was a collaboration between the Environmental Commission and ActiveSGV for the Bike Rides event, and with PlanetSave for the Eco-Summit.

The Earth Day Festival and the Bike Rides are conducted to raise awareness on many fronts of environmental initiatives and issues related to the Monterey Park community, such as energy savings, renewable energy, water conservation, alternative transportation, alternative fuel, waste and recycling, stormwater pollution prevention, air quality, healthy food, healthy living habits, and environmental education for kids. It's also an opportunity to educate the residents as well as businesses in our community on the importance of preserving our natural resources to curb climate change. The theme for this year's event was focused on energy conservation, in light of some of the initiatives and city's plan on improving and expanding the energy savings and renewable energy infrastructure in our community.

More than 120 riders participated in the two bike rides - the Hill Challenge Ride and the Family-Friendly Ride. The Hill Challenge Ride runs for about 14 miles long through most of the high elevated areas around the city. The Family-Friendly Ride strolls through the lower elevation (flat surfaces) city streets for approximately 5 miles. Both rides met at the El Encanto (the Greater Monterey Park Chamber of Commerce) for a rest stop and a quick tour of the city's historical landmark building.

Nearly 30 environmental organizations participated in the Earth Day Festival which featured various environmental topics and education for the public and the community of Monterey Park. These include our city utilities (San Gabriel Valley Municipal Water District and SoCalGas), waste haulers (Athens and Ware Disposal), LA County Public Works, LA County Sanitation Districts, the U.S. Forest Service, San Gabriel Valley Energywise Partnership, Global Energy Services, PACE, EVgo and many other organizations. Some of the highlights at this year's event include alternative fuel vehicles such as the natural gas vehicle (NGV) and the hydrogen fuel cell vehicle (FCV).

Other highlight festivities include science based environmental applications that were featured at the Earth Day Eco-Summit. Speakers, demonstrations, and presentations from various collegiate levels and organizations such as the CalState LA Hydrogen Station, USC Environmental Science, CalPoly Pomona Environmental Design, ELAC Biochemistry, Mark Keppel High School Environmental Science Club, PlanetSave, Science National Honors Society, and API Forward Movement brought various environmental research and related technologies. Each of the speakers presented their environmental topics and issues for the public during the event. More than 500 attendees including individuals, parents, and kids attended the Earth Day Festival and Eco-Summit, and visited the environmental booths that were filled with fun entertaining, educative and interactive games, as well as giveaways during the event.



Chick-fil-A Strives to Serve Quality Food Made with Care

Monterey Park residents can now enjoy a delicious Chick-fil-A Original Chicken Sandwich, a sandwich that took four years of experimentation and testing before being placed on the menu. The new Chick-fil-A restaurant is located in the Monterey Park Market Place right next door to In-N-Out Burger.

A little known fact, the "A" in Chick-fil-A stands for Grade A quality. Although Chick-fil-A is a fast food restaurant they are working towards a menu that is increasingly healthy and sustainable, "better-for-you fast food," as they state. They use 100 percent whole breast meat with no added fillers or hormones. They have removed high-fructose corn syrup from the buns, dressings, and sauces and reduced sodium by eight percent across 25 menu items. The salads are made fresh throughout the day by hand-chopping whole vegetables and fruits.

The founder, S. Truett Cathy always strived to serve quality food made with care, a legacy that is still being carried out today. Chick-fil-A only partners with U.S. suppliers that commit to meet and exceed their standards of farm animal welfare. Their chicken suppliers must hatch, raise and harvest in the U.S. and must have climate-control barns, where chickens are cage-free and free to roam. By the end of 2019, all the suppliers will be required to source chicken raised with no antibiotics of any kind starting from the egg. By the end of 2026 all their restaurants will source 100 percent cage free eggs.

A memorable part of the Chick-fil-A experience is the extraordinary customer service. Mr. Cathy believed that every customer that walks into the door should



be treated as they are the President of the United States. Employees are asked to always respond with "My pleasure" every time a guest says "Thank you." Stop by and "Eat Mor Chikin!"

Fourth of July Fireworks Guidelines

"Safe and Sane" fireworks are the only permitted products allowed in the city and only on July 4 from 10 a.m.-10 p.m.

The City of Monterey Park allows the use of fireworks on the Fourth of July from 10 a.m. to 10 p.m. only in the city; however, they are not allowed in city parks. Permitted fireworks must be "Safe and Sane" and cannot be modified or altered (MPMC 5.48.190).

Due to the extreme fire danger in California and to make sure everyone in the community can enjoy the holiday, the city encourages everyone to have a safe Fourth of July by ensuring the use of "Safe and Sane" fireworks only. Make sure children are supervised at all times when safe and sane fireworks are being discharged and also make sure to take care of your pets. At times, pets tend to be forgotten during the holiday. Due to pets' sensitivity to loud noises, fireworks can scare animals and cause them to run off. It is recommended to bring your pets indoors and play calming music while the fireworks are being ignited or seek the advice of your local veterinarian before the 4th.

The fire department's arson team and the police department will be patrolling the city to ensure safe preservation of the community. Citizens and visitors that fail to comply with the city's fireworks ordinance and are found with illegal fireworks, igniting illegal fireworks, allowing illegal fireworks to be discharged on their property or discharging safe and sane fireworks before July 4 may be susceptible to fines ranging from \$2,000 to \$5,000 and confiscation of the fireworks.

So enjoy the 4th of July, but remember to use Safe and Sane within the allowed times.

If you and your family would like to celebrate somewhere other than your home, join the City of Monterey Park at the 4th of July Celebration at Barnes Park, 350 S. McPherrin Avenue. 


Mark Keppel HS Student Wins Optimist International Oratory Contest

Night Sky Report

This month on June 21 at 9:00 a.m. is the summer solstice. "Solstice" means "Sun has stopped." No, this is not like what happened to Joshua. The Sun during the year moves north after the winter solstice, and south after the summer solstice. The solstices are where that northward or southward journey ends, with the Sun making a celestial U-turn and heading back the other way. It generally happens around the 21st or 22nd of December and June. The summer solstice is officially the start of summer. It marks a bad time for astronomers in the northern hemisphere, as the Sun doesn't set until after 8 p.m., and this means it doesn't get dark until 9, meaning short nights for astronomers.

As for the planets, this is where they'll be for the middle of June.

Mars is gone until 2020, being too small to observe.

Jupiter rises around 8:00 p.m. It's directly south around midnight. It's at opposition, which means it is opposite the Sun as viewed from earth. This means it'll be observable all night long. The markings on its disk and motions of its four brightest and largest satellites are fascinating to observe through any telescope, but you'll need a magnification of 60x or more.

Here are some dates and times when shadows appear on Jupiter's disk for June. I've limited the search for those events visible between 9 p.m.

and midnight.

- 3rd: Io's shadow crosses Jupiter's disk from around 11 p.m. to just past midnight.
- 11th: Ganymede's shadow crosses the disk from 9 p.m. to 11 a.m. This is the largest shadow any of the moons cast on Jupiter and it takes nearly two hours to cross the disk. Ganymede will be right beside its shadow and may be visible.
- 18th: A double event. Io and its shadow crosses Jupiter's disk from 9-11 p.m. Then from 12:30-2:30 a.m., Ganymede's shadow does the same.

Saturn is next, rising around 10:00 p.m. and it's directly south around 2:00 a.m. Its rings are tilted magnificently for viewers with telescopes. See how many of its moons you can spot with a telescope.

The image below shows what the sky looks like at mid June around midnight. We're looking south.



Venus rises just before 5:00 a.m. low in the east-northeast, a small, nearly full disk, but its

close location next to the Sun makes it a difficult and dangerous object to try and see, especially through a telescope, so wait a few months until it comes into the evening skies.

The lunar cycle is: New Moon 2nd; First quarter 10th; Full Moon 17th; and Last Quarter 25th.

Astute readers will note that these dates are a day or so earlier than in May. This is because the Moon goes from one New Moon to the next in 29.5 days. Since every month except February are one to two days longer than this, the dates slip behind one day each month.

The LAAS operates the Garvey Ranch Park observatory in Monterey Park, located just off the east parking lot. It is open to the public free of charge every Wednesday night from 7-10 p.m. The facility houses an 8-inch refracting telescope for visual observations, and a 4-inch telescope for photographing objects, weather permitting. People often set up their own telescopes out on the lawn beside the observatory. There is also a telescope making workshop on the ground floor. LAAS members are there to provide advice and knowledge on all things astronomical. If you have any questions on equipment, observing, or just want a peek through the observatory's scopes, drop on by! First-Gen San Gabriel High Senior Wins 12 Scholarships

San Gabriel High first generation senior, Kenny Lam, applied to 18 colleges. He won 12 scholarships to the most elite schools in the country, including Yale, Princeton and Brown University. Though he prefers not to talk about himself, Kenny agreed to a conversation to help other first-generation students learn from his journey.

He says it wasn't until high school that he realized "how much my parents have sacrificed for me and my sister." His mother and father were part of families with 13 children and had to stop their education to help their families. His parents emigrated to the U. S. from South Vietnam in late the late 1980's. One of Kenny's goals in going to college is repay his parents after all they have done for him.

Kenny says his parents did not pressure him, wanting him "to like school and enjoy life." All of his goal-directed behavior was "so I could learn what I really cared about." He urges students to wait to begin thinking about college until their junior year in order to first learn what "what really engages you, what you are passionate about." Then "when it is time to think about college, you know what you are genuinely interested in."

He says that thorough research into the process is the second step (after learning what you love) for any first generation student wanting to go to college. "It is complex, so you want to know all about the application process before you decide where to apply."

Kenny's real love is math and physics. His philosophy is "get out of my comfort zone for personal growth," and it led him to apply for co-editor-in-chief of the Matador so "I could break out of my shell, learn more compassion, and gain understanding of my peers."

Kenny is wearing a Princeton sweatshirt but says he is weighing all the options. Kenny says, "Most important to me is the financial aid package. Next, I think how will I fit in? Then I look at where I can do the best interdisciplinary work in math and physics."

In addition to Yale, Princeton and Brown, Kenny was offered scholarships to UC Davis, UCLA, UC San Diego, UC Berkeley, Harvey Mudd, Cal State LA, Cal State San Diego, Cal State Pomona, and Cal State San Luis Obispo. We know Kenny Lam will blaze a bright trail wherever he goes.

As Alhambra Unified fifth graders from Marguerita and Northrup Elementary gaze out at the historic national forest surrounding the YMCA of WSGV's Camp Ta Ta Pochon, the excitement on their faces is overwhelming. Most have never been away from home or seen mountains. They are here for the district's pilot Outdoor Science Camp experience, a program to be offered to all AUSD fifth grade students in the 2019-2020 school year.

In their two and half days at the nearly century old camp, students go on nature hikes and learn about the different types of trees in the old growth San Bernadino National Forest. They learn about natural streams, and about rocks and how they form. They will try out their skills in canoeing and archery, study the stars in the night sky, gather around a campfire.

The next round of fifth graders, students from Granada and Park Elementary, arrived on May 15, 2019, as the second half of the pilot for the Outdoor Science Camp.

蒙特利市公園允許在7月4日上午10點至晚上10點在城市裡燃放煙花。但不允許在城市公園內放煙花。合法使用的煙花必須是“安全和明智的”，不能被修改或改造 (MPMC 5.48.190)。

由於加州極端的火災危險，並確保社區中的每個人都可以享受假期，該市鼓勵每人僅使用“安全和明智的”煙花

來保證安全。當使用安全和明智的燃放煙火鞭炮時，確保孩子們在任何時候都受到監督，並照顧您的寵物。有時候，寵物往往會在假期間被遺忘。由於寵物對大聲喧嘩的敏感度，煙花會嚇跑動物並導致它們走散。建議將您的寵物帶到室內，在煙花點燃時播放平靜的音樂，或在七月四日之前徵詢當地獸醫的意見。

消防部門的縱火隊和警察局將巡邏市內，以確保預防社區的火災安全保護。在7月4日之前，市民和遊客未遵守城市煙花條例並被發現非法煙花爆竹，燃放非法煙花爆竹，在家裏燃放非法煙花，可能面臨罰款2,000美元至5,000美元並沒收煙花。

因此，盡情享受7月4日，但請記住住在允許的時間內使用“安全和明智的”燃放煙花。

Los fuegos artificiales permitidos deben de ser "Safe and Sane" y no pueden ser modificados o alterados (MPMC 5.48.190).

Debido al extremo peligro de incendios en California y para asegurarnos que todos en la comunidad puedan disfrutar del día de fiesta, la ciudad alienta a todos a tener un seguro Cuatro de Julio asegurándose que sólo se utilicen los fuegos artificiales "Safe and Sane".
