Monterey Park Police Department DUI/Driver's License Checkpoint August 16

Monterey Park, Calif. - August 15, 2019 - [Monterey Park Police Department](#) will be conducting a DUI/Driver's License Checkpoint on August 16, 2019, at an undisclosed location within the city limits between the hours of 6 p.m. to 2 a.m.

DUI checkpoints like this one are placed in locations based on collision statistics and frequency of DUI arrests. Officers will be looking for signs of alcohol and/or drug impairment, with officers checking drivers for proper licensing.

Monterey Park Police Department reminds drivers that "DUI Doesn't Just Mean Booze." If you take prescription drugs, particularly those with a driving or operating machinery warning on the label, you might be impaired enough to get a DUI. Marijuana can also be impairing, especially in combination with alcohol or other drugs, and can result in a DUI.



In 2017, 1,120 people were killed in alcohol-involved crashes on California roads. Last year, Monterey Park Police Department investigated 14 DUI collisions which resulted in 15 injuries.

Monterey Park Police Department offers these reminders to ensure you have a safe night of fun that doesn't involve a DUI:

- Always use a designated sober driver – a friend who is not drinking, ride-share, cab or public transportation – to get home.
- See someone who is clearly impaired try to drive? Take the keys and help them make other arrangements to find a sober way home.
- Report drunk drivers – Call 911.
- Hosting a party? Offer nonalcoholic drinks. Monitor who are drinking and how they are getting home.

Getting home safely is cheap, but getting a DUI is not! Drivers caught driving impaired and charged with DUI can expect the impact of a DUI arrest to be upwards of \$13,500. This includes fines, fees, DUI classes, license suspension and other expenses, not to mention possible jail time.
