





## Free Curbside Pickup Makes Disposing of Bulky Items Hassle Free

Keep Monterey Park clean, call Athens Services at 888-336-6100 for pickups in advance of your regular trash day

Bulky items are items too large to fit in your trash container such as household appliances, furniture, carpets, mattresses, clothing and oversized wood waste. Bundled cardboard and tree trunks/large branches are also considered bulky items as long as they are no larger than two feet in diameter and four feet in length. All you have to do is call Athens Services at 888-336-6100 during business hours at least 24 hours before your next trash collection day. Place bulky items out for pick-up by 6 a.m. on your trash pick-up day, but no earlier than 24 hours before your trash pick-up day; otherwise, owners may be cited by city staff. Please note that bulky items do not include E-Waste and Household Hazardous Waste.



## Stop When Traffic Signals Are Blacked Out

It is important to make a full and complete stop anytime drivers approach an intersection where traffic signals are not working

The Monterey Park Police Department would like to remind drivers what to do in the event of a traffic signal black out.

Traffic signals can go down for a variety of reasons. One reason is a power outage. If a power outage occurs, and you approach an intersection where the traffic signals are NOT working, you must STOP!



Drivers need to handle the intersection as you would an intersection with all-way STOP signs.

Remember your right-of-way protocol: If you and another vehicle on a cross street arrive at the intersection at the same time, then the vehicle on the left must let the vehicle to the immediate right go first. Drivers also need to be aware of pedestrians trying to cross the street at the intersection and allow them time to cross safely.

It is important to make a full and complete stop anytime you approach an intersection where traffic signals are not working. Failing to follow these rules of the road could lead to drivers being cited.

California Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle) administers a program to provide opportunities for beverage container recycling. The goal of this program is to reach and maintain an 80 percent recycling rate for all California refund value beverage containers- aluminum, glass, plastic and bi-metal. Projects implemented by cities and counties will assist in reaching and maintaining this goal.

The City of Monterey Park utilized this annual state allocation and collaborated with EcoHero Show to provide Monterey Park public elementary schools with environmental shows in the 2018-19 school year. At no costs to the school districts, students from TK to 6th grades are educated in a 40-minute assembly on topics ranging from recycling, food waste to renewable energy, and almost any eco topic in between.

Elementary schools that participated in this assembly provided by the City of Monterey Park during the 2018-19 school year included Bella Vista, Brightwood, Robert Hill Lane, Hillcrest and Ynez. The City of Monterey Park and EcoHero Show are looking forward to coming to engage more elementary school children in the 2019-20 school year.

## "Walking Soccer" Clinics and Open Play

# Night Sky Report

Nights are nice and long and the temperatures haven't dropped too much yet. Jupiter is gone from our evening skies and Saturn is quite low. We won't get good planet viewings until January or so, when Venus finally graces our evening skies, just as Jupiter and Saturn go behind the Sun on their journey to the morning skies. The constellations of autumn dominate the sky, while those of winter start to creep in towards the east.

The Moon begins the month as a moderately wide crescent in the evening skies and ends the month just about the same way: first quarter – November 4; full moon – November 12; last quarter – November 19; and new moon – November 26.

Venus is barely in the evening skies, setting right after the Sun does. It doesn't really become easily visible in the evening skies until January. Similarly, Jupiter is now lost to evening observers and won't be in the morning skies until January. So in a few months, we swap Venus for Jupiter. I'll write more about Venus in January.

Saturn is very low in the southwest. Binoculars and low power telescopes will show that Saturn is definitely oval in shape, not round, but you'll need magnifications around 50x or more to see the rings distinctly. Despite being just about everyone's favorite planet, Saturn is small. With the rings it appears about 45 times smaller than the Moon. But next month, Saturn becomes very difficult to observe, so by December we won't have planets gracing our evening skies.

Still overhead but to the right as you face south is the Summer Triangle, composed of Deneb on the upper left, Vega to the right of it, and Altair below both. Vega and Altair are bright and should punch through the sky glow every urban observer has to deal with. Above your head is the Great Square of Pegasus. North of it is the "W" of Cassiopeia. The faint glow to the East Northeast is the

Pleiades, a large bright open cluster of stars, a very fine sight in binoculars.

### Leonid Meteor Shower

The Leonid meteors streak across the sky, mostly during the nights of November 16-17. The rates are predicted to be low, perhaps two dozen or so per hour. The waning gibbous moon will interfere, as its light will allow only the brightest meteors to be seen even from dark skies. And to see any meteors at all, dark skies are needed. This means a site away from all city and town lights and their glows. And to add to the difficulties of seeing the Leonids this year, they are best seen in the early morning sky, beginning at 2 a.m. or so.

The Leonid meteors hit the earth on the earth's morning side. They are known to have some of the fastest meteors of any known shower, partially because those meteors smack into earth's atmosphere as the earth travels in the opposite direction, so the chances of seeing long streaks and bright ones increase. Think of driving in one direction and getting hit by sand going in the opposite direction, both at high speed.

The Los Angeles Astronomical Society (LAAS) operates the Garvey Ranch park observatory. The observatory is located just off the east parking lot. It's open to the public every Wednesday night from 7-10 p.m. An 8-inch 9-foot long refracting telescope is available to look through, weather permitting. People often set up their own telescopes out on the lawn beside the observatory. There's a telescope-making workshop on the ground floor, and LAAS members are ready to provide advice and knowledge on all things astronomical ... and perhaps on a few other things with a little coaxing. All of this is free of charge. So drop on by and bring your curiosity and sense of adventure! 
