To vote on any measure relating to the recall of any officer, punch the ballot card through the hole to the right of the arrow next to the word "YES" or next to the word "NO". To vote on the measure relating to the filling of the vacancy if the recall prevails, punch the ballot card through the hole to the right of the arrow next to the words "BY APPOINTMENT" or next to the words "BY SPECIAL ELECTION".

If a majority of the legislative body is in fact recalled, a special election shall be held regardless of the result of the vote on the measure relating to the filling of the vacancy if the recall prevails.

All marks except the punch hole are forbidden. All distinguishing marks or erasures are forbidden and make the ballot void. If you wrongly punch, tear or deface the ballot card, return it to the precinct board member and obtain another.

**ANSWER TO STATEMENT OF REASONS
FOR PROPOSED RECALL OF
BARRY L. HATCH**

This proposed recall is directed by developers who are extremely angry for my part in the moratorium on building construction to allow a master plan for properly developing our city.

I promised this moratorium to the voters of Monterey Park during my campaign in April.

What greatly concerns me is that the developers will promote racism and hatred to hide their greed for building profitable condos until the last available square inch in Monterey Park is gone.

I regret the petitioners are using senior citizens, whom I greatly admire and respect. They were not denied housing. The development group that was trying to squeeze apartment buildings in a zone of single-family homes was denied a zone change. Voters have spoken on this issue.

Every person and family in Monterey Park will continue to receive the best police and fire protection available anywhere – further, each department is expanding, even with the tax cut I supported.

Resolution 9004 requests the United States Government to strengthen and support immigration laws and to support English as the common language of America. If 9004 actually violates a single citizen's Constitutional rights as petitioners suggest, I will immediately move to rescind it.

SECTION 4. The City Council does declare and determine that:

As a result of the election, a majority of the voters voting on the measure relating to the recall of Patricia M. Reichenberger and Barry L. Hatch did not vote in favor thereof, and that Patricia M. Reichenberger and Barry L. Hatch were not recalled from the office of City Council.

AS a result of the election, on the question of filling the vacancy or vacancies if the recall prevails, a majority of voters voting on the question voted to fill the vacancy or vacancies by Special Election.

SECTION 5. The City Clerk shall enter on the records of the City, a statement of the result of the election, showing:

- (1) The whole number of votes cast in the City;
- (2) The measures voted upon;
- (3) The number of votes given at each precinct for and against each measure;
- (4) The number of votes given in the City for and against each measure;

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MONTEREY PARK
 RECITING THE FACT OF THE SPECIAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION HELD IN
 THE CITY ON JUNE 16, 1987, DECLARING THE RESULT AND SUCH
 OTHER MATTERS AS PROVIDED BY THE PROVISIONS OF LAW

WHEREAS a special municipal election was held and conducted in the City of Monterey Park, California, on Tuesday, June 16, 1987, as required by law; and

WHEREAS notice of the election was duly and regularly given in time, form and manner as provided by law; that voting precincts were properly established; that election officers were appointed and that in all respects the election was held and conducted and the votes were cast, received and canvassed and the returns made and declared in time, form and manner as required by the provisions of the Elections Code of the State of California for the holding of elections in cities; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 9079 adopted March 23, 1987, the City Clerk canvassed the returns of the election and has certified the results to this City Council, the results are received, attached and made a part hereof as "Exhibit A."

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MONTEREY PARK, CALIFORNIA, DOES RESOLVE, DECLARE, DETERMINE AND ORDER AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. That the whole number of votes cast in the City except absent voter ballots was 6,104.

That the whole number of absent voter ballots cast in the City was 2,420, making a total of 8,524 votes cast in the City.

SECTION 2. That the Special Municipal Election was held for the purpose of submitting to the voters of the City, the following questions:




