INSTRUCTIONS TO VOTERS

PLACE THE BALLOT CARD COMPLETELY FLAT WITHIN THE BALLOT TRAY.

To vote for a candidate of your choice, move the white punch head over the CIRCLED CROSS ⊕ to the right of the name of the candidate and completely depress the chrome plated lever, which will PUNCH OUT THE CIRCLED CROSS ⊕ in the voting square. Where two or more candidates for the same office are to be elected, PUNCH OUT THE CIRCLED CROSS ⊕ to the right of the names of all candidates for that office for whom you desire to vote, not to exceed, however, the number of candidates to be elected.

To vote for a person not on the ballot card, (A WRITE IN), write the name under the title of the office in the blank space provided for that purpose and PUNCH OUT THE CIRCLED CROSS ⊕ to the right of the name you have written in.

To vote on a measure appearing on the ballot, PUNCH OUT THE CIRCLED CROSS ⊕ in the voting square to the right of the word "YES" or to the right of the word "NO".

All distinguishing marks or erasures are forbidden and make the ballot void.

If you make a mistake, tear or deface any portion of your ballot card, replace the card in the Ballot Envelope and return it to the Inspector for another set.

MAKE SURE YOU VOTE BOTH SIDES OF YOUR BALLOT CARD.

PLACE YOUR BALLOT CARD IN THE BALLOT ENVELOPE WITH THE NUMBERED STUB AT THE TOP AND HAND IT TO THE INSPECTOR, WHO SHALL, IN THE PRESENCE OF THE VOTER, REMOVE THE NUMBERED STUB, HAND SAME TO THE VOTER AND DEPOSIT THE VOTED BALLOT IN THE BALLOT BOX.

HOW TO VOTE YOUR BALLOT CARD


STEP 1

Vote only one ballot card at a time. Place the card completely flat within the ballot card tray.




STEP 2

Move the white punch head to the right of the candidate or measure of your choice and completely depress the chrome-plated lever which will punch out the circled cross ⊕. Repeat the process until you have voted for all candidates or measures of your choice.



STEP 3

After you have completed voting, return the white punch head to the top position. Place your ballot cards with the stub at the top, in the ballot envelope and hand it to the Inspector.

ARGUMENT IN FAVOR OF APPOINTIVE CITY CLERK

The office of City Clerk does not involve policy-making decisions. It requires a mixture of skills and professional competence for the performance of important clerical duties. Monterey Park needs the most competent person available for this position. The best way to obtain such a person is through widespread recruitment and competitive examinations.

It is important to make the office appointive since an elected City Clerk is virtually accountable to no one. There is no check and balance with an elected City Clerk. The citizens have no way of evaluating the Clerk's performance. If an elected City Clerk is incompetent, oblivious to citizens' needs, or decides not to come to work at all, the only recourse is a citizen initiated recall election or a lawsuit, either of which cause great expense to our citizens.

If the Clerk is appointive, the appointing authority and the City Council can assure that either the job is performed properly for the benefit of the citizens or a new Clerk is appointed.

Because of the problem of accountability, voters throughout the State recognize the need for an appointive Clerk. The trend in this direction is unquestionable with most cities appointing rather than electing City Clerks. In the last seven years, twenty-five new cities formed in California and twenty-two of them chose to appoint City Clerks.

The premise that an elected City Clerk assures a "check and balance" with the City Council is nonsense. The City Clerk has no responsibility that even remotely oversees or limits the function of the Council or any other office.

A "yes" vote is a vote for professional competence and service to the people.

ARGUMENT IN FAVOR OF A "NO" VOTE ON THE MEASURE FOR APPOINTIVE CITY CLERK

The right to vote is a priceless American heritage. The basic tenet of our system of government is the belief that concentration of authority leads to concentration of power and its subsequent abuse.

Each elected official has a specific function to perform, and is directly responsible to YOU and the law. They should complement each other, working together as a team, but at the same time functioning as a "Check and Balance" on their respective powers.

. . . Unless YOU VOTE "NO" on the Measure, your right to elect your City Clerk will be taken away. An elective official in any post is more responsive to the public than an appointed official — and can be removed by the electorate at any time if majority desires. This is the basic fundamental principle behind elective representative government in America.

. . . Unless YOU VOTE "NO", the "Check and Balance" of an elected City Clerk, who protects your rights for the safekeeping of official documents and records of your City government, will be lost and be controlled by an appointed official who is not answerable to you but only to the City Manager or City Council.

. . . Unless YOU VOTE "NO", the preservation of the sanctity of the ballot is removed. Your elected City Clerk is responsible for the conduct of Municipal elections, including checking voting results precinct by precinct — certifying the accuracy of votes cast. Therefore, to insure the sanctity of the ballot, responsibility must be to the electorate and not to the City Manager or Council.

. . . Unless YOU VOTE "NO", you open the door to bureaucracy and possible "machine politics" taking over your City government and you will remove your right to elect your public officials with a "Check and Balance" system of government.

Applications are accepted for mailing Absent Voters Ballot:

First Day – January 4, 1974

Last Day – February 26, 1974

Absent Voters Ballot will not be available until February 4, 1974.

1. A separate application is necessary for each person for each election.
2. Application must be filled out completely. It is important that **reason** for absentee ballot be checked in the appropriate box.
3. Application must be signed by the applicant as he is registered and **received** no later than February 26, 1974. If applicant is a War Voter, last day is February 28.
4. When you receive your ballot, vote and return it immediately. It must be received by the clerk or by a precinct board of any polling place in the city not later than the close of the polls on the day of the election.
5. Reasons for absent voter ballot other than shown on the application below are:
 - a. Voter in hospital, sanitorium, or nursing home on election day.
 - b. Voter will not be in precinct on election day due to conditions arising after 7th day before election, February 27, 1974.

RESOLUTION NO. 7765

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MONTEREY PARK, CALIFORNIA, RECITING THE FACT OF THE GENERAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION HELD IN SAID CITY OF MONTEREY PARK ON THE 5TH DAY OF MARCH, 1974, DECLARING THE RESULT THEREOF AND SUCH OTHER MATTERS AS ARE PROVIDED BY LAW.

WHEREAS, a regular general municipal election was held and conducted in the City of Monterey Park, County of Los Angeles, State of California, on Tuesday, the 5th day of March, 1974, as required by law; and

WHEREAS, notice of said election was duly and regularly given in time, form and manner as provided by law; that voting precincts were properly established; that election officers were appointed and that in all respects said election was held and conducted and the votes cast thereat, received and canvassed and the returns made and declared in time, form and manner as required by the provisions of the Elections Code of the State of California for the holding of elections in cities; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 7752 adopted the 28th day of January, 1974, the City Clerk of the City of Monterey Park canvassed the returns of said election and has certified the results to this City Council, said results are received, attached and made a part thereof as "Exhibit A."

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MONTEREY PARK, CALIFORNIA, DOES RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. That there were 53 voting precincts established for the purpose of holding said election consisting of consolidations of the regular election precincts in the City of Monterey Park as established for the holding of state and county elections.

SECTION 2. That said regular municipal election was held for the purpose of electing the following officers of said City as required by the laws relating to cities in the State of California, to wit:

THREE (3) Members of the City Council of said City for the full term of four years;

SECTION 3. That at said regular general municipal election, the following measure was submitted to the electors of said City, to wit:

"Shall the office of City Clerk be appointive?"

SECTION 4. That the whole number of votes cast in said City (except absent voter ballots) was 7197.

That the whole number of absent voter ballots cast in said City was 84, making a total of 7281 votes cast in said City.

SECTION 5. That the names of persons voted for at said election for Member of the City Council of said City are as follows:

That the measure voted upon at said election is as follows:

"Shall the office of City Clerk be appointive?"

That the number of votes given at each precinct and the number of votes given in the City to each of such persons above named for the respective offices for which said persons were candidates and for and against the measure are as listed in Exhibit "A" attached.

SECTION 6. The City Council does declare and determine that:

George Ige was elected as Member of the City Council of said City for the full term of four years;

George W. Westphaln was elected as Member of the City Council of said City for the full term of four years;

Matthew G. Martinez was elected as Member of the City Council of said City for the full term of four years;

That as a result of said election, a majority of the qualified voters voting on said measure relating to the office of City Clerk did not vote in favor thereof, and that said measure was not carried, and shall not be deemed adopted and ratified.

SECTION 7. The City Clerk shall enter on the records of the City Council of said City, a statement of the result of said election, showing in "Exhibit 'A'", attached:

- (1) The whole number of votes cast in the city;
- (2) The names of the persons voted for;
- (3) The measures voted upon;
- (4) For what office each person was voted for;
- (5) The number of votes given at each precinct to each person, and for and against each measure;
- (6) The number of votes given in the city to each person, and for and against the measure.

RESOLUTION NO. 7765

SECTION 8. That the City Clerk shall immediately make and, upon compliance by the persons elected with the provisions of Section 11565 and Section 11568 of the Elections Code of the State of California, shall deliver to each of such persons so elected a Certificate of Election signed by her and duly authenticated; that she shall also administer to each person elected, the Oath of Office prescribed in the State Constitution of the State of California and shall have them subscribe thereto and file the same in her office. Whereupon, each and all of said persons so elected shall be inducted into the respective office to which they have been elected.




