Dear Registered Voter,

The City Election on April 12 will be the first of three elections for you in 1988. This is where you determine who will represent you in City Government. The key words in the previous sentence are "...you determine...". You have that right, we have that right, to determine whom we chose as representatives. We will have the opportunity twice more this year to elect candidates to fill state and national offices.

The City of Monterey Park, with about 63,000 people filling its boundaries, has roughly 23,300 registered voters. This is a high percentage of registered voters by most comparative standards. If the average American family has 2.1 children, then we should have about 15,366 families in Monterey Park. By logical extension, Monterey Park should have about 38,000 people of voting age. If those figures are correct, almost 62% of you have registered to vote. That is higher than most cities.

But the acid test will come on April 12. How many of you will take the time to actually vote? The election in October certainly broke no records. You stayed away in droves--only 13.5%, including absentee voters, bothered to vote. In certain areas to our east, some voting precincts had almost 45% voting.

You have the right and the privilege to vote--or not to vote. Not many countries in the world have that privilege, let alone that right. Will you set a good example? "Our democracy was created by men who fought for the right to vote so that their descendents could exercise their right not to vote."--Anon. But with apologies to Lincoln, a government of the people, by the people and for the people will perish from the earth unless we do what is necessary to keep that government representative. The way to do that is simple--you vote.




VOTING INSTRUCTIONS

Remove ballot card from gray envelope

Step 1. Using both hands, insert the ballot card all the way into the Vote Recorder.



Step 2. Be sure the two slots in the end of your card fit down over the two red pins.




Step 3. To vote, hold the voting instrument straight up. **Punch straight down** through the ballot card for the candidates of your choice. **Do not use pen or pencil.**

Step 4. Vote all pages.

Step 5. After voting, remove the ballot card from the Vote Recorder.

Step 6. Turn ballot card over and COMPLETELY REMOVE ALL HANGING CHAD from each voting hole you punched.

Step 7. Put ballot card back in gray envelope.



NOTE: If you make a mistake, return your ballot card and obtain another.

INSTRUCTIONS TO VOTERS: Remove the card from the gray write-in ballot envelope. Place the card all the way into the Vote Recorder. To vote for a candidate whose name appears on the ballot, punch the ballot card through the hole by the arrow next to the candidate's name. Where two or more candidates for the same office are to be elected, punch the ballot card through the hole by the arrow next to the names of all candidates for that office for whom you desire to vote, not to exceed, however, the number of candidates who are to be elected.

To vote for a qualified write-in candidate, write the title of the office and his name in the blank space left for that purpose on the write-in ballot envelope.

All distinguishing marks on the ballot card are forbidden and make the ballot void.

If you wrongly punch, tear or deface the ballot card, return it to the precinct board member and obtain another.

RESOLUTION NO. 9198

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MONTEREY PARK, CALIFORNIA, RECITING THE FACT OF THE GENERAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION HELD ON APRIL 12, 1988, DECLARING THE RESULT AND SUCH OTHER MATTERS AS PROVIDED BY LAW

WHEREAS a General Municipal Election was held and conducted in the City of Monterey Park, California, on Tuesday, April 12, 1988, as required by law; and

WHEREAS, notice of the election was given in time, form and manner as provided by law; that voting precincts were properly established; that election officers were appointed and that in all respects the election was held and conducted and the votes were cast, received and canvassed and the returns made and declared in time, form and manner as required by the provisions of the (Elections Code of the State of California for the holding of elections in general law cities); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 9174 adopted January 11, 1988, City Clerk canvassed the returns of the election and has certified the results to this City Council, the results are received, attached and made a part hereof as "Exhibit A."

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MONTEREY PARK, CALIFORNIA, DOES RESOLVE, DECLARE, DETERMINE AND ORDER AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. That the whole number of votes cast in the City except absent voter ballots was 6,785.

That the whole number of absent voter ballots cast in the City was 1,363, making a total of 8,148 votes cast in the City.

Louise Davis was elected as City Treasurer for the full term of four years.


SECTION 5. The City Clerk shall enter on the records of the City Council of the City, a statement of the result of the election, showing:


SECTION 7. That the City Clerk shall certify to the passage and adoption of this resolution and enter it into the book of original resolutions.


